Dear Dr. Pipher,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your letter dated August 22, 2019 reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Brown University. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that during a recent semiannual inspection it was determined that a mouse that had been reported as in need of euthanasia by a veterinary technician two days prior was not euthanized by the lab nor had the veterinary technician nor the lab followed-up on the report. The animal was now moribund and was immediately euthanized. It was not stated if this protocol was PHS or NSF funded.

Corrective actions include: Animal Care will issue a new plan for communication and processes to ensure that treatments/euthanasia requests are followed as directed, and; the PI will create a process to ensure that the laboratory has acknowledged receipt of Animal Care staff notices and a confirmation of treatment/euthanasia has been sent.

Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate this incident, provide corrective measures, and prevent recurrence. OLAW advises that the IACUC consider communicating the new plan by Animal Care to *all* labs using animals. OLAW concurs that the incident warranted reporting. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

The Brown University IACUC, through the Institutional Official (Jill C. Pipher, Ph.D.), is writing to provide OLAW with a final report of the following noncompliance with the *PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals* ("PHS Policy"):

During semi-annual facility inspections occurring on July 31, 2019, the inspection team identified an animal welfare concern related to a moribund mouse that had been flagged with a health monitoring card. A veterinary technician had identified the health concern and notified the lab that euthanasia needed to be conducted by the laboratory, close of business the following day. Neither the veterinary technician nor the PI's laboratory followed up on the euthanasia notice sent. As a result, the animal was found in a moribund state during semi-annual inspections two days later which resulted in immediate euthanasia of the mouse.

The IACUC discussed the incident of animal welfare concern and determined that it is reportable under the NIH NOT-OD-05-034, "Guidance on Prompt Reporting to OLAW under the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals":

The following corrective action has taken, or will take, place:

- Animal Care will conduct a process evaluation for communication and follow-up responsibilities when sending notices to Principal Investigators. This evaluation will result in a new plan for communication and processes to ensure that treatments/euthanasia requests are followed as directed.
- The PI will create a process to ensure that the laboratory has acknowledged receipt of Animal Care staff notices and a confirmation of treatment/euthanasia has been sent.

Brown University is committed to protecting the welfare of animals used in research and
