This represents the semiannual report of the Institutional Animal Care and use Committee (IACUC), to the Institutional Official, as required by the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals as a condition of this Institution's Animal Welfare Assurance with the Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) and USDA Animal Welfare Regulations, as applicable.

The Semiannual Program Evaluation and Facility Inspection occur during the Fall and Spring of each year. The inspection will be conducted using the Facility Inspection Checklist and the standards set forth in the Animal Welfare Act Regulations, and the ILAR Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals. Committee members review and approve the Semiannual report.

#### Process of Review of the Animal Care and Use Program:

The IACUC conducted its semiannual review of the Institution's animal care and use program on October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2019 using the Revised 8<sup>th</sup> Edition of Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals (Guide), and, as applicable, USDA Animal Welfare Act Regulations and Standards, 9 (CFR) Chapter I, 2.31.

The purpose of the IACUC review of the Animal Resource Program and Facility Inspection is to ensure compliance with local, state and federal regulations and standards. Semiannual evaluation subcommittees are selected with a minimum of two IACUC members to perform the Semiannual Program Evaluation and Facility Inspection. The IACUC Administrator coordinates the subcommittees and inspection times and locations. No IACUC member is excluded from the opportunity to participate in a facility inspection.

The segments of the Semiannual Review included 1) Physical Facilities/Laboratory Animal Housing and Daily Care, 2) Veterinary Medical Care Program, 3) IACUC Policies and Procedures.


