Dear Dr. Van Scott,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your May 7, 2019 letter reporting two instances of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at East Carolina University, following up on an initial telephone report on February 22, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands the following about the incidents and the corresponding corrective actions:

 Mice were used in a toxicity study that had not been approved by the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC).

Corrective actions: The IACUC required the Principal Investigator (PI) and staff to undertake retraining, to submit a protocol amendment, and to receive retraining on the use of procedure cards and biosafety issues.

2) A student in the same laboratory sustained a needle stick while handling a toxic compound. The animal care staff had not been notified about the use of hazardous chemicals as required.

Corrective actions: The IACUC prohibited handling of toxins by unapproved personnel and suspended all protocols involving hazards for this PI. All laboratory staff must certify understanding of the content of all protocols, including use of hazard agents. The animals were placed on a holding protocol and the PI was asked to respond regarding prevention of noncompliance. This did not occur and therefore all five protocols were terminated. The co-investigators submitted their own new protocols, completed required training along with staff, and submitted the certifications. The protocols were approved, the original PI is not conducting animal activities, and none of these activities were PHS supported.

Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate, correct, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance. We appreciate having been informed about this matter and find no cause for further action by this Office.

This letter serves as a final report concerning two noncompliances by a single investigator at East Carolina University, Assurance #A3469-01. An initial verbal telephone report was made by Dr. Dorcas O'Rourke, Attending Veterinarian, on 02/22/19. The IACUC's actions concerning both incidents are as follows.

Incident #1

The Principal Investigator attempted an unapproved toxicity study on mice in November 2018. The incident was reported to the IACUC at the 12/10/18 convened meeting, and an investigation into noncompliance was conducted. A report of the investigating subcommittee's findings was presented to the convened IACUC on 01/14/19, and the IACUC sent a letter to the PI on 01/16/19 with the following requirements for the PI and all laboratory personnel:

- Completion of retraining, specifically utilizing CITI modules and exams;
- 2. Submission of amendment detailing all toxicity studies, including rigorous justification, humane endpoints, and proper methodology;
- 3. Completion of retraining and exam on the proper use of procedure cards; and
- 4. Face-to-face training with Biosafety officers and EH&S personnel on safe handling and use of chemicals.

All lab personnel completed the CITI training by 01/30/19.

An amendment describing toxicity studies was submitted for IACUC review at the convened meeting on 01/14/19 and brought back for full committee review on 02/4/19. This amendment had not been approved at the time of the second noncompliance incident.

Procedure card training was not completed at the time of the second noncompliance incident.

Face-to-face safety training occurred on 02/8/19.

Incident #2

On 02/4/19, a student working in the PI's laboratory sustained a needle stick while handling a toxic compound. The student had just been added to the protocol to perform a specific behavioral test on the mice. It was also discovered that the PI had not notified animal care staff of hazardous chemical use as required by the approved protocol and institutional policy. The IACUC chair immediately called a convened meeting, and on 02/6/19, the IACUC voted to stop all handling of toxins by unapproved persons and appointed a subcommittee to investigate other allegations of noncompliance regarding this protocol. The subcommittee conducted an exhaustive investigation which included interviewing all lab members. The PI did not meet with the subcommittee on either of the agreed-on dates, 02/8/19 and 02/14/19. The IACUC met on 02/18/19, discussed the findings of the subcommittee, and voted to suspend all protocols involving hazards (4) that were currently approved for the PI until the following criteria were met:

- All laboratory personnel signed attestations that they had read and understood all protocols
 that they were approved to participate in, including specific procedures related to use of
 hazards;
- The PI demonstrated to the IACUC how he would ensure that these types of noncompliance would not re-occur.

All animals assigned to the suspended protocols were subsequently placed on a holding protocol, and no one from the lab group was permitted access.

The PI was asked to provide a response to the IACUC by the 04/8/19 meeting, either in writing or in person. He did neither. On 04/16/19, the PI terminated all five of his protocols. Other scientists who had been working as co-investigators on these terminated protocols submitted new protocols of their own. They and their lab personnel completed all specific training as prescribed by the IACUC, signed attestations as required, and were approved to continue their work independently. The responsible PI is not currently conducting research using live vertebrate animals.

NIH supported none of the work described in either of the noncompliances.

ECU remains committed to upholding the highest standards of animal care and use, and we feel that the actions taken were appropriate in this situation. Please let us know if you require additional information.
