Dear Dr. Pipher,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your letter dated August 26, 2020 reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Brown University. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that during semi-annual facility inspections on July 13, 2020, it was determined that a laboratory failed to provide post-operative monitoring to mice for the required three days, and thermal support, as approved within the IACUC animal use protocol. According to the PI this was due to a misunderstanding between lab members. This animal activity was PHS-supported.

Corrective and preventive actions included the lab creating a plan to ensure someone will be available to care for the animals according to their approved IACUC protocol moving forward.

The PI confirmed that they will provide post-operative thermal support moving forward and has communicated this to the lab.

Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate this incident, provide corrective measures, and prevent recurrence. OLAW concurs that the incident warranted reporting. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

The Brown University IACUC, through the Institutional Official (Jill C. Pipher, PhD), is writing to provide OLAW with a final report of the following noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals ("PHS Policy"):

During semi-annual facility inspections July 13, 2020, the inspection team identified non-compliance relating to failure of the laboratory to provide post-operative monitoring for the required three days as approved within the IACUC animal use protocol and failure of the lab to provide post-operative thermal support to animals that underwent survival surgery. There were no mouse animal deaths as a result of this non-compliance.

The IACUC discussed this issue of noncompliance at its convened meeting on August 7, 2020, and understands that the following corrective actions have taken or will take place:

- The PI acknowledged that there was a misunderstanding between the lab members as it
  related to the approved phase one research plan for when members could enter the lab
  based on Institutional COVID-19 Policies. The lab created a plan to ensure someone will be
  available to care for the animals according to their approved IACUC protocol moving
  forward.
- The PI confirmed that they will provide post-operative thermal support moving forward and has communicated this to the lab.
