2020 OLAW Annual Report Addendum

Changes in CHLA's program for animal care and use as described in the Assurance are as follows:

- 1. In response to the pandemic, the CHLA IACUC has instituted the following social distancing measures to prevent the spread of disease:
 - The IACUC has instituted use of alternatives to face-to-face meetings such as video conferencing (see NOT-OD-06-052).
 - For IACUC members who do not have access to software that generates digital
 signatures, an email acknowledgement from the member(s) may serve as their
 acceptance with the semiannual report. At minimum, the email shall state "This serves
 as my signature for the semi-annual report". It will be clear that the email is from the
 IACUC member and the date of the item being approved will be specified. These emails
 will be retained for the record by the IACUC.
 - The IACUC has determined the best means of conducting facility inspections during a pandemic may include use of a single person employing remote methods such as live stream video to allow for IACUC members to remotely but actively participate in the inspection process, including asking questions of the person on site. Alternately, for areas housing non-USDA regulated species, the IACUC may use as few as one qualified individual on site to conduct the inspections. As stated in the CHLA PHS Animal Welfare Assurance, no IACUC member will be involuntarily excluded from participating in facility inspections and conflicts of interest will be avoided. The IACUC still remains responsible for the evaluation and report to the Institutional Official.
- 3. The CHLA IACUC has revised the existing Animal Care and Use Program Disaster Plan to include additional information in response to state mandated 'stay at home' requirements.
- 4. Section III.E of the CHLA Assurance states that, "For all non-CHLA employee research personnel involved in the care and/or use of laboratory animals, the LAOHP medical health questionnaire must be completed in coordination with the annual review of approved protocols (Continuing Review and Three Year Rewrite). Non-CHLA employee research personnel have 30 days from the protocol annual review approval date to obtain occupational health clearance, after which time their approval to work on the protocol and access to the animal facilities is withdrawn until they obtain occupational health clearance."

The IACUC agreed that under specific circumstances wherein a Principle Investigator never enters the CHLA animal facility and never handles or is exposed to research animals, the requirement to submit the LAOHP medical health questionnaire may be waived. This is not a blanket exemption, but a waiver may be individually granted following annual review of approved protocols.

6. Section VI.A of the CHLA Assurance states that, "The Institutional reporting period is the calendar year (January 1 – December 31)."

Per NOT-OD-21-003, the reporting period for the 2020 calendar year has been changed to January 1 - September 30 and for all years moving forward the reporting period will run from October 1 - September 30.
