As reported last year, timing of facility inspections needed to be altered given university constraints on the number of people who could be in buildings at any given time. Due to the easing of restrictions across time, two sets of facility inspections were carried out in 2021 as shown in II.B. Going forward, semi-annual inspections will be carried out in April and October rather than May and November as stated in the current approved Assurance.
