

Important Information about our Animal Care and Use Program Accredidation Site Visit (AAALAC) June 19-21, 2019

Dear Colleagues,

On **June 19-21** AAALAC will be conducting its triennial site visit of the Central and Waterfront Campus animal care and use facilities and many research laboratories that use animals. Maintaining AAALAC Accreditation of our program shows a commitment to providing responsible animal care, promoting animal wellbeing and enhancing research.

AAALAC is a private nonprofit organization that promotes the humane treatment of animals in science through a voluntary accreditation program. OHSU has been fully accredited since 1963. Continued accreditation is dependent upon passing a rigorous evaluation of the program of animal care and use by experts in laboratory animal science every three years and annual reports on the status of the animal facility. Please see the attachment "What research staff needs to know about our Accreditation Site Visit" for additional information.

We appreciate your cooperation in maintaining an exemplary animal care and use program at OHSU and request that you help make this a successful site visit by doing the following:

- Clean and organize all areas within your laboratory and procedure rooms where animals are used or taken.
- Clean and organize any supplies that you keep within animal housing rooms. All containers containing feed, medication, liquids or other items should be labeled with the name of the substance and expiration date.
- Discard all expired medications, anesthetics, sutures,
 vacutainers or other materials that are used in animals in your animal housing room as well as your laboratory. If you have expired materials that you are using in vitro, please label them Not Used in Animals.
- Wear the appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) while
 working in your animal housing room or when working with your
 animals in your lab. At a minimum this would be a lab coat or cover
 gown, gloves, closed toed shoes and leg coverings. Some areas have
 additional requirements. For a complete listing please see the IACUC
 Policy Requirements for Personnel Identification & Protective
 Clothing.
- Adhere to all IACUC policies on the use of animals.
- Site visitors will request to see your surgery logs including anesthesia, analgesia, post-operative care and controlled substance logs. Please have them up to date and ready for viewing.
- Site visitors may also request to see any training logs and/or inquire
 as to how you were trained to perform procedures with animals. The
 IACUC Policy Training Requirements for Research Staff in the Use of

Animals (excluding Non-Human Primates on the West Campus) provides additional information.

- Site visitors may also ask whether you are enrolled in the
 Occupational Health Program (ReadySet) and whether you are aware
 of the symptoms of rodent allergy. Allergy symptoms include: stuffy
 nose, itchy eyes, itching skin, coughing, skin rashes, difficulty
 breathing or other respiratory problems.
- Be familiar with the ways OHSU can help protect your valuable mouse lines in the event of an emergency/disaster or an unexpected attrition of those valuable founders.
- Cryopreservation of germplasm (i.e., embyros or sperm) with the OHSU Transgenic Core. The Core uses Speed Cryo technology to preserve your most important work. Germplasm is stored in two different geographic storage freezers to best ensure the security of your lines.

Cryopreservation is also an invaluable tool to save on the expansive costs of line maintenance (e.g., per diems, personnel time to manage the colony, cost for genotyping, the time cost away from performing other work) of models that you may not work with right away.

2. DCM's *Gold Star Program* is an animal priority program in the event of an emergency or disaster. Laboratories can identify up to five (5) cages, per protocol, that will be prioritized for protection and/or movement by DCM staff should an emergency or disaster occur. Laboratories can pick up gold star stickers to flag cages from DCM's

Main Office (LBRB B110). These gold stickers must be visible at <u>all</u> times on the cage card to ensure cage identification. Laboratories are also required to keep their contact information up-to-date with DCM. Due to the unknowns during a disaster, DCM cannot guarantee the protection of all gold star program cages; however, we will make every possible effort to protect and relocate these cages, should the need arise.
