Dear Dr. Katz,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your September 14, 2021 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of California-Berkeley, following up on an initial report on August 25, 2021. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on three separate occasions an expired analgesic was given to a nonhuman primate. No adverse effects were noted due to use of the expired drug.

The corrective action consisted of discarding the expired agent and obtaining new stock. The veterinary staff was retrained, the tracking and identification of expiration dates was refined, and all pharmacy locations are checked monthly for expired substances, which are removed.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy.

This is to follow up on the preliminary report you received via email on August 11, 2021 from Dr. Rebecca Armstrong, Director, Office for Animal Care and Use (OACU) on behalf of the Animal Care and Use Committee (ACUC) regarding a USDA citation for a NHP that occurred at our institution.

As previously noted in the preliminary report, at the USDA's routine site visit on July 20-21, 2021, the VMO identified a discrepancy for a NHP where the record concerning the animal's water restriction and consumption for the month of July did not adhere to what the IACUC had approved in the protocol (i.e. the animal got less water than it was supposed to get daily). While the animal's health and well-being did not appear to be affected in any way as noted in their Inspection Report, the USDA did cite UCB under 2.31(c)(7) Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) - for the PI not submitting this significant change to the IACUC for review and approval.

A subsequent thorough investigation by the ACUC determined that it was a serious noncompliance with PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals. On July 21 when ACUC notified the PI, lab personnel immediately followed the protocol as it was written and the PI submitted an amendment to ACUC to correct/clarify the protocol and ensure compliance in all future experiments. The ACUC accepted this plan, and approved the amendment.

The PI has informed the ACUC that the activities were performed under any Public Health Service funding, by NIH, R01MH117763 - Frontostriatal Rhythms Underlying Reinforcement Learning.

As Institutional Official, I am satisfied that the campus has spared no resources in resolving this unfortunate incident and thereby has fulfilled its commitment to maintaining the highest standards of animal welfare, as described in our Animal Welfare Assurance.
