Dear Dr. Connor,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your July 15, 2021 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Wisconsin - Madison. Your letter supplemented the information in the telephone report on July 6, 2021. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on April 29, 2021, a research veterinarian mistakenly used a modified-live herpesvirus vaccine rather than a killed vaccine to vaccinate five cats from a research colony. The principal investigator was notified of the error and determined that the animals were no longer appropriate for the colony due to the potential for shedding of feline herpesvirus. Instead, these animals provided tissue samples critical for another scientific aim of the research project. The animals were associated with a PHS-supported activity.

Corrective and preventive measures included retraining of the veterinarian and veterinary technician involved by the Chief Campus veterinarian and veterinary technician supervisor and the clinical guidelines for vaccination were updated.

The consideration of this matter by the University of Wisconsin - Madison was consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. Similarly, the actions taken to address the issue and prevent recurrence were appropriate. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

The University of Wisconsin-Madison, in accordance with Assurance A3368-01 and PHS Policy IV.F.3, provides this report of an incident first reported to you via telephone call from Janet Welter, DVM, Chief Campus Veterinarian on July 8, 2021.

On April 29, 2021, a research veterinarian was performing routine, colony-management vaccinations of 8-week-old cats from a colony used for glaucoma research. A modified-live herpesvirus vaccine rather than a killed vaccine was administered to five animals.

The principal investigator was notified of the error and determined that the animals were no longer appropriate for the colony due to the potential for shedding of feline herpesvirus.

Instead, these animals provided tissue samples critical for another scientific aim of the research project.

Retraining of the veterinarian and veterinary technician involved was completed by the Chief Campus veterinarian and veterinary technician supervisor and the clinical guidelines for vaccination were updated. The animals were associated with a PHS-supported activity.

The School of Veterinary Medicine Animal Care and Use Committee discussed this incident and the corrective measures at their monthly meeting on July 13, 2021 and required no further action.
