The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your May 3, 2021 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Wake Forest University. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that a member of the research team consolidated mice from different cages during euthanasia against institutional policies. This study was PHS funded.

As a corrective measure, the Attending Veterinarian (AV) retrained the research team and explained expectations in terms of compliance with proper euthanasia techniques and the AV will coordinate with the lab manager to promote compliance amongst all members of the research team.

OLAW appreciates the prompt consideration of this matter by Wake Forest University which is consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. OLAW expects continuing post-approval monitoring to prevent recurrence of this non-compliance and potential associated animal welfare concerns. Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate steps have been taken to investigate this incident and to attempt to prevent recurrence. Relevant costs will be paid from a nonfederal source, as appropriate.

Incident:

A member of the research team consolidated mice of different cages during euthanasia against institutional policies.

Preliminary Report:

No preliminary report was made to OLAW regarding this incident.

Resolution:

The IACUC approved the following actions to resolve this incident:

- The Attending Veterinarian retrained the research team and explained expectations in terms of IACUC compliance with regard to proper euthanasia techniques.
- 2. The Attending Veterinarian will coordinate with the lab manager to promote compliance amongst all members of the research team.

All actions have been completed/implemented at this time, and the WFU IACUC considers this matter closed. Program oversight staff will continue to monitor animal care and use procedures to ensure compliance with IACUC approved processes.
