The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your letter dated April 21, 2021 reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of California, Riverside. Your letter supplements the information in the prompt, preliminary telephone report on March 17, 2021. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that during the March 11, 2021 IACUC semiannual inspection, survival surgeries on a mouse were observed being performed in the Pl's laboratory. The protocol did not include approval to perform surgeries in the lab. In addition, aseptic technique was not followed, the animal was recovering without a heating source, and the secondary container for diluted analgesic drug was not properly labeled. This activity was PHS supported.

Corrective and preventive actions included the Pl agreeing to voluntarily cease all surgeries until a detailed remediation plan was submitted and the laboratory staff were retrained in proper surgical technique. The remediation plan was accepted by the IACUC.

OLAW appreciates the prompt consideration of this matter by the University of California, Riverside, which was consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate corrective measures have been put in place. Please be sure that no charges are made to the grant for unapproved procedures. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

Dear Dr. Morse,

This letter is to formally report a situation involving vertebrate research noncompliance at the University of California, Riverside. Our PHS Assurance number is D16-00278. PHS funding, NIH grant R01HD091167, was involved.

During the March 11, 2021 IACUC semiannual inspection, survival surgeries were observed being performed in the PI's laboratory as part of a training exercise. The protocol did not include approval to perform surgeries in the lab. In addition, aseptic technique was not followed, the animal was recovering without a heating source, and the secondary container for diluted analgesic drug was not properly labeled.

The IACUC had a preliminary discussion of this noncompliance at its convened meeting on March 15, 2021. It was determined that the chair, vet, and IACUC office staff would meet with the PI to investigate the issue and ascertain the details for further review by the IACUC.

The meeting with the PI occurred on March 16, 2021. The PI agreed to voluntarily cease all surgeries until she submitted a detailed remediation plan and the laboratory staff were retrained in proper surgical technique. The remediation plan was reviewed by the IACUC chair and attending veterinarian and deemed appropriate.

The thorough investigation was followed by a final review and discussion at the April 19, 2021 convened meeting of the IACUC. The committee determined that though a noncompliance with animal welfare impact had occurred, the appropriate steps had been taken to investigate and rectify the situation to prevent a reoccurrence, and no further actions were needed.
