Dear Ms. Mellouk,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your October 12, 2021 final letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Boston University. A preliminary telephone report was provided on September 30, 2021. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on September 23, 2021, an Animal Science Center (ACS) technician found two moribund mice that had undergone surgery the previous day and per veterinary order, the animals were humanely euthanized. Two other animals that had undergone surgery the previous day were bright, alert and responsive. There was no documentation of analgesia administration or post-operative records available as described in the approved protocol. The lab member agreed to provide buprenorphine at 1pm on September 23, 2021. The Post-Approval Monitoring (PAM) Program Manager contacted the lab member twice on September 27, 2021 for information and requested surgery and post-operative monitoring records however no records were provided, and the lab member described an issue with the vaporizers during surgery. The vaporizers were checked, and no issues found. On October 4, 2021, the PAM Program Manager reminded the Principal Investigator (PI) and lab member about adherence to approval protocols and provided institutional policies on surgery, recordkeeping and suggested forms. The study was PHS funded.

As a corrective measure, presurgical notification and postsurgical records are to be provided to the veterinarian for the next three months and records are to be maintained at the room level. The IACUC Chair requested that the PI voluntarily stop surgery until retraining as occurred. A meeting between the PI, lab member, PAM Program Manager and Veterinarian was held on October 8, 2021 for training, discussing topics included in the incident, reporting concerns, recordkeeping and switching to buprenorphine sustained-release formula. Additionally, a for-cause PAM visit will be scheduled.

OLAW appreciates the prompt consideration of this matter by Boston University which is consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. OLAW expects continuing post-approval monitoring to prevent recurrence of this non-compliance and potential associated animal welfare concerns. Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate steps have been taken to investigate this incident and to attempt to prevent recurrence.

Boston University, in accordance with Assurance D16-00204 (A3316-01) and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this final report of serious noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals. A preliminary report of this incident was provided to OLAW via voicemail on 9/30/21.

On 9/23/21, an Animal Science Center (ASC) technician found two moribund mice that had undergone surgery the previous day; these mice were cuthanized per veterinary order. Two other mice that also had surgery the previous day were bright, alert, and responsive. There was no documentation of analgesia administration or postoperative records available as described in the approved protocol.

The IACUC discussed the incident at its October 5, 2021 meeting. The Committee accepted the following corrective and preventive actions:

- The lab member agreed to provide buprenorphine at 1 pm on 9/23/21.
- The PAM Program Manager contacted the lab member twice on 9/27/21 for information and requested surgical and post-operative monitoring records. No records were provided, and the lab member described an issue with the vaporizers during surgery.
- The Veterinary Services Manager checked the vaporizers in question and found no issues. The vaporizers have since been used without incident.
- The PAM Program Manager reminded the PI and lab member on 10/4/21 about adherence to the approved protocol and sent institutional policies on surgery, recordkeeping, and suggested forms.

## The IACUC further required:

- Surgical records are to be maintained at the room level.
- Presurgical notification and postsurgical records are to be provided to the Veterinarian for the next three months.
- The IACUC Chair requested that the PI voluntarily stop surgery until retraining has occurred.
- A meeting with the PI, lab member, PAM Program Manager, and Veterinarian was held on 10/8/21 for retraining. Topics discussed included the incident, what to do if there are problems, how to keep surgery and post-procedure monitoring records, and switching to Buprenorphine SR.
- A for-cause PAM visit will be scheduled.
