Dear Ms. Mellouk,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your December 21, 2021 letter reporting a serious deviation from the provisions of the *Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals* at Boston University, following up on an initial telephone report on December 13, 2021. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that sixteen naked mole rats died due to a temperature spike caused by a malfunction of the heating, ventilation, air conditioning (HVAC) system.

The immediate action taken upon discovery consisted of providing supportive care to the remaining 68 mole rats, which all survived. The maintenance staff was notified and restored temperature/humidity, a data logger was placed into the room, hourly room checks are being performed by facilities staff, and additional plans are being developed. The Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee required an updated telephone tree for emergency contact of animal care and research staff. Facilities maintenance staff will provide a plan for maintaining and monitoring the room.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to reduce the likelihood of a recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the action taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals. Note that it is highly recommended that room alarms are present in animal rooms with remote staff notification capability. Inexpensive units are available commercially, including in local hardware stores, as an interim application. Thank you for keeping OLAW apprised on this matter.

Boston University, in accordance with Assurance D16-00204 (A3316-01) and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this final report of serious deviation from the Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals, 8<sup>th</sup> edition. A preliminary report of this incident was provided to OLAW via voicemail on 12/13/21.

On 12/8/21, the temperature and humidity control in the naked mole rat room malfunctioned resulting in a temperature spike. Sixteen naked mole rats died; all others were treated, provided supportive care, and monitored. One animal was later euthanized by the investigator. A total of 68 animals survived.

The IACUC discussed the incident at its December 14, 2021 meeting. The Committee accepted the following corrective and preventive actions:

- · Facilities was notified; temperature and humidity recovered
- · Veterinarians, vet techs, and others provided animals with supportive care
- A data logger was placed in the room
- Hourly checks by Facilities of temperature and humidity were put in place with notification to Animal Science Center (ASC) Operations Manager and backup in case of disturbance
- Additional contingency plans are being developed

The IACUC further required:

- Immediate emergency phone tree including ASC, PI, and research personnel to be put in place with
  existing monitoring system if room deviates from temperature range
- Plan from Facilities for maintaining and monitoring this room
- Follow up report at next IACUC meeting
