The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your April 25, 2022 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Columbia University. Your letter supplements the information in the initial prompt telephone report on March 11, 2022. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on March 3, 2022, your institution was notified that four mice had been housed in a laboratory for four days without IACUC approval. The associated activity was PHS-funded.

Corrective and preventive measures included counseling of lab members regarding adherence to the IACUC approved protocol and instructing them on the importance of contacting the IACUC or Institute of Comparative Medicine offices if they have any questions regarding post-procedure housing, or any other concerns. The IACUC Office Director met with the laboratory members to discuss regulatory requirements regarding care and use of laboratory animals, as well as compliance expectations.

OLAW appreciates the consideration of this matter by Columbia University, which was consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate this incident, correct the noncompliance, and prevent recurrence. OLAW concurs that the incident warranted reporting. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

On March 11, 2022, Columbia University (the "University") notified the Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare ("OLAW") by telephone of a reportable situation involving noncompliance observed during an Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee ("IACUC" or the "Committee") compliance monitoring visit to a lab. The animals involved were being used in research supported by the Public Health Service under NIH grant number 5P01HL087123-14.

This letter reports the results of a review of the matter and the corrective actions taken by the IACUC.

Background and Investigation

On March 3, 2022, an IACUC Compliance and Training Coordinator notified Dr. Mary Jo Shepherd, Executive Director of the Office of the IACUC, that four mice had been housed in a laboratory for 4 days without approval.

Dr. Shepherd notified the IACUC Chair when she learned of the compliance monitor's findings and an investigation was initiated. The IACUC investigative team (Dr. Shepherd and another IACUC member) met with the principal investigator and the individual primarily responsible for the noncompliance. They also met separately with the IACUC Compliance and Training Coordinator who discovered and reported the noncompliance.

Corrective Actions

A report from the investigative team was provided to the IACUC and a convened meeting of the Committee, at which a quorum was present, was held on April 14, 2022. Following review of the facts and discussion, the Committee imposed the following corrective measures:

The investigator was required to fully implement and continue to adhere to his plan for correction, which included counseling of lab members regarding adherence to the IACUC approved protocol, and instructing them on the importance of contacting the IACUC or Institute of Comparative Medicine offices if they have any questions regarding post-procedure housing, or any other concerns. The investigator also arranged for Dr. Shepherd to meet with his laboratory members via Zoom to discuss regulatory requirements regarding care and use of laboratory animals, as well as compliance expectations.
