Dear Dr. Giannelis,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your February 14, 2022 letter reporting an incident of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals within the animal care and use program at Cornell University. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that seven mice pending euthanasia were found in a procedure room that was not an approved housing location. The mice did not have a water source and were hunched, dehydrated, and some were ataxic. The mice were provided with wet food and water, and the principal investigator (PI) was alerted to attend to the animals. The following day the same cages of mice were found in the same location. The veterinarian alerted the PI a second time and ensured that the mice were euthanized. The mice involved in this incident were supported by NIH funding.

Corrective and preventive measures included counseling of the PI and responsible laboratory member regarding standards of daily animal care and the distinction between housing and procedure spaces. The importance of providing access to water was emphasized. The PI assured that mice will always be provided with water moving forward, that all laboratory members understand the issues related to this incident, and that they will exercise increased diligence with their mice.

OLAW appreciates the consideration of this matter by Cornell University which was consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. It is concerning that the PI required two notifications regarding the situation, and still did not attend to her mice. However, based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate this incident and prevent recurrence. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

As Institutional Official for Cornell University's animal care and use program, I am reporting an issue of noncompliance involving mice that occurred under our General Assurance. This issue was reported to the IACUC at the December 16, 2021 meeting, and the IACUC agreed that the corrective actions taken were appropriate.

Explanation of the situation:

On 11/18/2021, seven mice pending euthanasia were found in a procedure location that is not an approved housing location. Additionally, the mice were left without a source of water. Mice were hunched, dehydrated, and a few were noted to display ataxic ambulation. Mice were provided with wet food, Nutri gel, and water. The CARE veterinarian contacted the Principal Investigator (PI) and asked the PI to ensure that the mice were attended to immediately.

On 11/19/2021, the same cages of mice were found in the same procedure location. The CARE veterinarian contacted the PI to inform her of the animals' current status, and to remind her of the important distinction between animal housing and procedure spaces. The CARE veterinarian confirmed that the mice were euthanized.

Action taken by the institution:

The PI was reminded to adhere to the provisions of her protocol, including standards of daily care (e.g., access to food and water), and that mice cannot be housed in a procedure location without IACUC approval. The PI was asked to remind her staff of the difference between housing and procedure spaces.

CARE veterinarians and the facility manager met with the PI and one of her lab members. They discussed details of the study and the importance of providing water to mice. CARE veterinarians were assured that mice will always be provided with water going forward, and that mice will never be housed in the procedure location. The CARE veterinarians were assured that the lab understands the issues related to this adverse event and their plans to exercise increased diligence with their mice.
