Dear Dr. Norton,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your June 2, 2021 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Florida. This letter had not been preceded by a preliminary report to OLAW.

According to the information provided, this Office understands that the University of Florida Animal Care and Use Committee (ACUC) determined that instances of noncompliance occurred with respect to: the conduct of animal-related activities without prior IACUC review and approval. The final report states laboratory staff surgically implanted abdominal windows on 6 non-survival and 7 survival mice. The surgery is not included in the approved protocol. It is understood that personnel performing the surgeries are listed on the protocol as performing surgery and have completed the required training. In response to the incident, all mice were euthanized. The IACUC voted that the matter as a noncompliance and required the following corrective actions:

- A modification has been submitted to add the abdominal window procedure.
- Within 2 weeks, the principal investigator (PI) must contact the IACUC office to schedule a post approval monitoring (PAM) visit.
- Within 2 weeks, the PI must submit a plan to the IACUC for ensuring protocol compliance. This should include a plan for onboarding of new staff as well as a plan for continuing compliance.
- Data obtained from animals that underwent unapproved procedures must not be used for any purpose.

It is noted that this research is supported by PHS funds. Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that the University of Florida has implemented appropriate measures to correct and prevent recurrences of these problems and is now compliant with provisions of the PHS Policy. We appreciate being informed of these matters and find no cause for further action by this Office.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

The University of Florida, in accordance with Assurance D16-00244 (A3377-01) and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report of a noncompliance regarding unapproved survival and non-survival surgical procedure performed in mice. A preliminary report was not sent to OLAW regarding this noncompliance.

Laboratory staff surgically installed abdominal windows on 6 non-survival and 7 survival mice. This surgery is not outlined in the approved protocol. Personnel performing the surgeries are listed on the protocol as performing surgery and have taken the required training. All mice have been euthanized.

The IACUC full committee voted on May 4, 2021 that these incidents were a noncompliance and the following corrective actions are required:

- A modification has been submitted to add the abdominal window procedure.
- 2. Within 2 weeks, the PI must contact the IACUC office to schedule a post approval monitoring (PAM) visit.
- 3. Within 2 weeks, the PI must submit a plan to the IACUC for ensuring protocol compliance. This should include a plan for onboarding of new staff as well as a plan for continuing compliance.
- 4. Data obtained from animals that underwent unapproved procedures must not be used for any purpose.

The animals involved in this incident are funded by the following grant:

The NIH funding components have been notified of the noncompliance.
