The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your March 14, 2022 letter concerning a report of a noncompliance with the Public Health Service Policy on the Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals within the animal care and use program at SRI International. Your letter supplements the information contained in a preliminary phone report submitted on March 1, 2022. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on February 20, 2022, one female cynomolgus macaque, being held on a PHS-funded contract, escaped her primary enclosure via an opening between a tunnel structure attached to the cage to provide additional exercise and enrichment. She received a small bite wound on her toe from another NHP in theroom. The event took place on a Sunday afternoon, with the NHP discovered on top of her cage at approximately 7:45 am Monday morning. She was treated by the SRI veterinary staff immediately and was able to return to social housing with her female cage mate the next day.

The husbandry staff identified the cage manipulation that allowed the female NHP to enlarge the opening between the cage and exercise tunnel, and thus escape from the cage. The staff placed additional straps to firmly secure the exercise tunnel to the cage to prevent future escapes. All other cages with exercise tunnels were secured in the same manner pre-emptively.

The funding agency will be notified separately.

SRI International's reporting of the matter was consistent with the philosophy of self-regulation. Similarly, the action taken to respond to the issue and prevent recurrence was appropriate. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

Dear Dr. Morse:

This letter is the written report of the incident phoned in by SRI's IACUC Chair on March 1, 2022.

The incident involved 1 NHP being held for potential future studies for the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID), Division of Microbiology and Infectious Diseases (DMID) contract # HHSN272201800001I.

In SRI's Menlo Park animal facility, tunnel structures are often attached to the cages of both singly and pair or group housed nonhuman primates for additional exercise and enrichment. After regular business hours on 2/20/22, one female cynomolgus macaque escaped from her cage and received a small bite wound on her toe from another NHP in the room. The event took place on a Sunday afternoon, with the NHP discovered on top of her cage at approximately 7:45 am Monday morning. She was treated by the SRI veterinary staff immediately, and was able to return to social housing with her female cage mate the next day.

The husbandry staff identified the cage manipulation that allowed the female NHP to enlarge the opening between the cage and exercise tunnel, and thus escape from the cage. The staff placed additional straps to firmly secure the exercise tunnel to the cage to prevent future escapes. All other cages with exercise tunnels were secured in the same manner pre-emptively.

The funding agency will be notified separately.

SRI fully understands all the implications that may arise from an escaped NHP and will take all necessary precautions to prevent a recurrence. Please do not hesitate to contact me should you have any questions.
