Dear Dr. Taubman,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your August 18, 2021 final letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Rochester. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on August 18, 2021 the University Committee on Animal Resources discussed the Vivarium self-report of a discovery that over the weekend, a plug was accidently disconnected on a ventilated rack containing 300 mice of which, a total of 20 mice had died. Funding information for the study was not provided.

As a corrective measure, the vivarium submitted an action plan including retraining, detailed logging and the installation of lockboxes to prevent a rack from being pulled away from an active outlet.

OLAW appreciates the prompt consideration of this matter by the University of Rochester which is consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. OLAW expects continuing post-approval monitoring to prevent recurrence of this non-compliance and potential associated animal welfare concerns. Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate steps have been taken to investigate this incident and to attempt to prevent recurrence.

Report of Non-Compliance

During the August 18, 2021, meeting of the University Committee on Animal Resources there was a discussion of a serious issue of non-compliance concerning a ventilated mouse rack that became unplugged and caused the death of several animals.

The Vivarium office self-reported the discovery that over the weekend, the plug had accidentally been disconnected for a PNC ventilation rack containing approximately 300 mice; 17 mice had died with an additional 3 subsequently succumbing.

The Vivarium submitted an action plan to ensure that this will not occur; this plan includes retraining, detailed logging, and the installation of lockboxes to prevent a rack from being pulled away from an active outlet. The committee reviewed and approved the plan, but still voted to report this incident of noncompliance to OLAW.
