The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your June 15, 2021 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Minnesota. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on May 25, 2021, cages of 10 rats were flagged with a restriction card for staff not to feed animals. During this time, animals were not fed for 12 hours to prime them to perform behavioral tasks and it was discovered that the protocol did not have food restriction approved on the protocol. Animals were placed back on their normal feeding schedule. This study was supported by PHS funding.

As a corrective measure, an amendment under the protocol will be submitted for adding food restriction for approval by the IACUC before performing this procedure.

Dear Dr. Wolff,

In keeping with the terms of our assurance, please be informed that we are making a report of noncompliance of an IACUC approved, NIH funded study involving rats. The basis of this report results from a self-reported incident. The report outlined that on May 25, 2021, the cages of 10 rats were flagged with a restriction card for RAR staff not to feed the animals. During this time, animals were not fed for 12 hours to prime them to perform behavioral tasks. It was soon discovered that the protocol did not have food restriction approval and animals were immediately placed back on their normal feeding schedule.

We want to inform you that we consider this matter closed. The report from the PI stated that food restriction of rats under this protocol will be delayed until a protocol amendment adding this procedure has been submitted and approved by the IACUC.
