Dear Dr. Reuter,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your April 30, 2021 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Colorado-Boulder, following up on an initial report on March 31, 2021. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that 13 mice were subjected to facial vein bleeds although this activity had not been described in the approved protocol. The study was supported by the NASA Translational Research Institute (TRISH).

The corrective action consisted of counseling the junior veterinary technician responsible on performing only those procedures approved in the protocol. The protocol was subsequently amended to include facial vein bleeds.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy.

Protocol: 2807 Funds: NASA Translational Research Institute (TRISH) Species: Mouse

On 3/29/21 a junior vet tech was performing a technical service, cervical dislocation, for the lab which was approved on the protocol. The lab planned to collect blood following euthanasia, but found that the euthanasia method prevented them from getting the volume of blood needed. As a result the junior vet tech recommended performing facial vein bleed on conscious mice to collect the blood and then proceeded to perform this procedure on 13 mice. Facial vein blood collection was not approved on the protocol.

The vet tech's supervisor and Attending Veterinarian discussed with the junior vet tech and reiterated the importance of reviewing the protocol prior to performing any technical services to confirm what procedures are approved. The IACUC will also remind the lab if procedures are not approved in the protocol they cannot be performed by the lab or vet staff until approved in the protocol. The lab did submit an amendment to add facial vein blood collection to the protocol, which was approved.
