The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your April 1, 2022 memo regarding an incident of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the National Institute for Child Health and Human Development. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on September 27, 2021, a technician reported to the Research Investigator that an animal on their protocol was at its humane endpoint as described by the veterinary pre-approved treatments. The report indicated that the animal would be euthanized by 2 pm that day unless they heard back from the investigator. The investigator did not respond but the technician failed to perform the euthanasia until the next day.

To correct the issue and prevent recurrence, retraining occurred, and the Facility SOP was amended. Animals requiring euthanasia now receive priority treatment and a room tagging procedure has been implemented to identify animals given an endpoint. The senior tech checks for tags during their PM walk through. Technicians were trained on these new procedures.

The action taken to resolve the issue and prevent recurrence was appropriate and accepted by OLAW. Please be sure to include the animal species in all reports. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.



Failure to Follow Veterinarian's Directive

Incident

On 9/27/21, a technician in the NICHD Shared Rodent Facility reported to the Research Investigator that an animal on their protocol was at its humane endpoint as described by the veterinary pre-approved treatments. Their email indicated that the animal would be euthanized by 2 pm that day (9/27) unless they heard back from the investigator. The investigator did not respond but the technician failed to perform the euthanasia until 9/28/21.

NICHD Investigation and Response

This incident was reviewed by the full ACUC at our October 20, 2021 meeting. To prevent recurrence, we have performed retraining but also amended our Facility Standard Operating Procedures. First, Animal Techs assigned to sick log duty are now allocated time daily (at 2 PM) to review the sick log and health tech emails. Animals requiring euthanasia receive priority treatment. Second, we have implemented an independent system to track critical cases on a room-by-room basis. Briefly, when an animal is given an endpoint, a tag is put on the outside door of its holding room. This tag is only removed when the animal is euthanized. The senior tech checks for tags during their PM walk through.

Technicians were trained on these new procedures which were implemented on October 25, 2021. Our Animal Program Director reported to the ACUC at our January 19, 2022 meeting that implementation was successful.
