When ad hoc consultants are utilized, the IACUC remains responsible for the evaluation of the inspection findings, establishing a reasonable and specific plan and schedule for correcting each deficiency, as well as reporting the evaluation to the IO. Inspection findings are reviewed by the IACUC member(s) who performed the inspection, a subcommittee of the IACUC, or at a convened meeting of a quorum of the IACUC. Findings for inspections performed by ad hoc consultants are reviewed by the IACUC Chair, a subcommittee of the IACUC, or at a convened meeting of a quorum of the IACUC. The Chair, IACUC inspector, IACUC subcommittee, or full committee of the IACUC during the review of the findings would categorize the deficiencies as significant or minor and establish a reasonable and specific plan and schedule for correcting each deficiency.
- 2. Change in Annual Continuing Review for USDA Regulated Species Section III.D.9): As an alternative to completing an Annual Review form in the on-line submission system, the PI or their staff may participate in a post-approval monitoring audit of the AUP. The IACUC then reviews the resulting report in place of the Annual Review form.
