The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your May 19, 2021 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at The Methodist Hospital Research Institute. Your letter supplements the March 8, 2021 prompt preliminary report and the March 25th interim report. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that a possible exposure of Comparative Medicine staff to Mycobacterium tuberculosis (MTB) had occurred in the ABSL3 facility due to inoculation of animals with MTB on 2/10/2021 that was not communicated to the Comparative Medicine Department. There was no animal concern. The research is NIH funded.

A subcommittee of the IACUC met on March 4, 2021 and made a determination that noncompliance had occurred, including: failure to follow the direction of the AV; failure to follow the IACUC and Safety Committee Protocols; failure to post required study cage cards at the time of inoculation to notify staff that an infectious agent had been used; and failure of the Pl to provide adequate oversight of the work in the ABSL3.

At a convened meeting on March 23, 2021, the IACUC voted to suspend two related Animal Use Protocols (AUP) as well as the research scientist's access to the ABSL3 facility.

A Corrective Action Plan (CAP), that assures adequate Pl oversight, compliance with all policies and procedures, adherence to approved AUPs, retraining of research staff, and communication with Comparative Medicine Program (CMP) and the Biosafety Officer (BSO) was submitted, modified following subcommittee review, and then reviewed and approved by a quorum of IACUC members on April 15, 2021. Both protocols that were previously suspended were re-instated. The IACUC also approved an amendment changing the Pl to enable greater oversight, and an attestation from the research staff acknowledging the authority of the AV and BSO. The IACUC required additional post approval monitoring of compliance with the CAP. This will occur at least monthly for the next 6 (six) months and a report provided to the IACUC.

Parameters have been set in place by the AV and BSO which must be completed and documented prior to re-entry into the ABSL3 facility.

The CMP staff, who were potentially exposed to MTB due to this incident, have engaged in a surveillance program with Employee Health. This involved an initial TB screening following the incident. A second screening has been completed and has shown no exposures.



This is the final report for the concern initially submitted to OLAW on March 8, 2021 with an update submitted on March 26, 2021, regarding a possible personnel exposure to Mycobacterium tuberculosis (MTB) that occurred in the ABSL3 facility due to inoculation of animals with MTB without prior notice to the Attending Veterinarian (AV) and staff.

A subcommittee of the IACUC met on March 4, 2021 and made a determination that noncompliance had occurred, including: failure to follow the direction of the AV; failure to follow the IACUC and Safety Committee Protocols; failure to post required study cage cards at the time of inoculation to notify staff that an infectious agent had been used; and failure of the PI to provide adequate oversight of the work in the ABSL3. This letter is written to follow up on the initial report of a concern submitted to OLAW on March 8, 2021 regarding a report to the Chair of Houston Methodist Research Institute's (HMRI) IACUC, David R. Beers, Ph.D. from the Attending Veterinarian, Tanya Herzog, DVM DACLAM (AV) that a possible personnel exposure to Mycobacterium tuberculosis (MTB) occurred in the ABSL3 facility due to inoculation of animals with MTB.

The research is NIH funded through an (b) (4) This is a multi-PI grant.

This incident continues to be investigated by the IACUC subcommittee. The preliminary findings and responses from the PI were reviewed at the March 23, 2021 IACUC meeting. The Committee found that this constituted noncompliance including: failure to follow the direction of the AV; failure to follow the IACUC and Safety Committee Protocols; failure to post required study cards at the time of inoculation to notify staff that an infectious agent had been used; and failure of the PI to provide adequate oversight of the work in the ABSL3.

The PIs reported that the work was conducted under two approved IACUC protocols but due to cage card notations, it is unclear under which protocol this work was being conducted. Due to these findings, the IACUC voted to suspend both approved protocols as well as the research scientist's access to the ABSL3 facility until the corrective action plan is reviewed and approved. We expect this to occur at the April 27, 2021 meeting and will provide another update at that time.

This letter is written to report a concern received by the Chair of Houston Methodist Research Institute's (HMRI) IACUC, David R. Beers, Ph.D. from the Attending Veterinarian (AV), Tanya Herzog, DVM DACLAM.

The research is NIH-funded through an

On 3/2/21, Dr. Herzog reported to the IACUC Chair that a possible exposure of the Comparative Medicine staff to Mycobacterium tuberculosis (MTB) had occurred in the ABSL3 facility due to inoculation of animals with MTB on 2/10/2021 that was not communicated to the Comparative Medicine Department.

There was no animal concern. The immediate safety of animal care staff is the IACUC chief concern.

A subcommittee of the IACUC was convened and has begun investigating the incident. Preliminary findings are that noncompliance occurred which led to the potential harm of animal facility staff and that this event is reportable to the IACUC, OLAW, and the Funding agency. All work in the ABSL3 under this protocol has been stopped pending IACUC review of the incident.

The IACUC subcommittee continues to investigate this incident as well as perform a root cause analysis (RCA) and will provide a full report of the incident, the proposed actions, and any additional finding to the IACUC at the next scheduled meeting on March 23, 2021.

The Institution takes the welfare of animals and staff very seriously and has instituted a root cause analysis (RCA). The status of the employee surveillance program, investigation and IACUC review will be reported within the next month.
