The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges your October 6, 2021 letter, reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Rutgers University. Your letter supplements the information in the initial phone report on September 28, 2021. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on April 5, 2021 one rat with a tail injury was observed and a second rat with a similar injury in the same animal room was observed on April 12, 2021. The first rat was euthanized. The second rat expired while under anesthesia during an attempt to repair the injury. The same animal care technician was assigned to perform husbandry duties in that animal room on both of the days injured rats were observed. That individual was initially re-assigned to non-animal duties and is currently no longer employed by the university. These animals were supported by NIH funds.

Corrective and preventive measure included a routine refresher training session on animal health concerns and reporting health issues for all husbandry staff. The refresher training was already planned independent of this incident.

The prompt consideration of this matter by Rutgers University was consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. Similarly, the routine retraining of staff would be expected to prevent such incidents in the future. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

Dear Dr. Morse.

Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey hereby makes the final report for the following incident, reported to OLAW via telephone on September 28, 2021. One rat with a tail injury was observed on April 5, 2021 and a second rat with a similar injury in the same animal room was observed on April 12, 2021.

The following actions were taken in response to this incident:

- The first rat was euthanized. The second rat expired while under anesthesia during an attempt to repair the injury.
- A thorough investigation occurred. Although no one admitted responsibility for causing the injuries,
  the same Comparative Animal Resources (CMR) animal care technician was assigned to perform
  husbandry duties in that animal room on both of the days injured rats were observed; therefore, we
  are reasonably confident of the identity of the individual responsible for both tail injuries. That
  individual was initially re-assigned to non-animal duties and is currently no longer employed by the
  university.
- A routine refresher training session on animal health concerns and reporting health issues for all CMR staff was already planned independent of this incident but will help serve as a preventative measure against future incidents of this nature.
- At its regular meeting on May 19, 2021, the IACUC reviewed and discussed these incidents and unanimously voted to report this matter to OLAW. The IACUC also voted to accept the above noted corrective actions.

Please note that these animals were supported by NIH funds.
