III. D. 2) Institutional Program for Animal Care and Use –IACUC Semiannual Inspections

NOTE: In order to accommodate the restrictions set forth by the 2020 pandemic, a temporary waiver was requested from and granted by OLAW in March 2020. In the ensuing months, we have resumed and expanded our inspection coverage to include those areas deemed safely accessible to inspectors. This includes all centralized animal housing and procedure rooms as well as PI managed housing rooms. In July 2021, pre-pandemic routine inspection schedules per Section IV.B.2. (PHS Policy) of all institution's animal facilities resumed. Additionally, make up inspections to areas that had not been inspected during the shutdown were performed.
