Dear Dr. Moler,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your May 24, 2022 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Stanford University, following up on an initial telephone report on January 28, 2022. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that twelve mice failed to receive post-operative analgesia as stipulated in the approved protocol.

The corrective actions consisted of requiring the surgeons to undertake retraining, having surgical records reviewed by the laboratory animal care office, and ensuring that the surgical team review the relevant rodent survival surgery guidelines and protocol. The laboratory was placed under enhanced post-approval monitoring.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy.

As Stanford University's authorized institutional official under its PHS Assurance (Animal Welfare Assurance #A3213-01), I am writing to notify OLAW of a reportable incident as defined in PHS Policy IV.F.3.

IACUC determination	Serious noncompliance
Funding	National Institutes of Health awards RO1NS100180, R01AG070839

Description:

At a convened meeting, the IACUC discussed an allegation of noncompliance involving mice. After undergoing a surgical procedure, 12 mice were not provided post-operative analgesia as described in the approved IACUC protocol. The IACUC determined that this incident met the definition of serious noncompliance as it constituted a failure to adhere to the PHS "Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals" and resulted in actual harm to animals.

A preliminary report of this incident was provided to OLAW on January 28th, 2022, via a telephone call from the Associate Director of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Program, Research Compliance Office.

IACUC Determination:

An IACUC subcommittee met to review these concerns and the corrective actions that had been taken. Based on its review, the subcommittee recommended that this incident be classified as serious noncompliance as it constituted a failure to adhere to the PHS "Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals".

At the convened meeting, the IACUC discussed the subcommittee's recommendation. A motion to accept this finding was made, seconded and approved. A determination memo from the IACUC Chair has been sent to the Protocol Director (PD).

Corrective Actions and Follow up:

The PD reported that the following had been done proactively:

 A post-approval monitoring visit overseen by a veterinarian took place to establish compliance with the approved protocol.

The IACUC requested that in addition to this corrective action that the PD:

- Have all survival surgeons listed on the protocol retake the hands-on rodent survival surgery course offered by the Veterinary Service Center.
- Ensure that the surgeon who performed the surgeries in question submit their next 5 survival surgical records to the APLAC office for review.
- Have anyone performing survival surgery review the <u>IACUC Rodent Survival Surgery Guideline</u> and the relevant APLAC protocol. Documentation of this training will be reviewed by the IACUC.

Concluding Remarks:

The IACUC has carefully reviewed this incident with all parties involved. Stanford believes that a recurrence of an incident of this nature is unlikely as all parties have received appropriate training, and the PD is committed to preventing a future occurrence.
