Dear Dr. Russell,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your June 28, 2021 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals within the animal care and use program at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center. Your letter supplemented the information contained in an initial telephone report to this office on April 15, 2021. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on April 8, 2021, a research staff member left two rats in a transport container in the vivarium overnight without food or water. The animals were found by animal facility staff and immediately placed into clean cages. Veterinary staff assessed the animals for general health and minor fight wounds. No medical treatment was needed. The rats involved in this incident were supported by NIH funding.

Corrective and preventive measures included counseling of the responsible research staff member by a senior liaison from the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) on April 8 and 9, 2021. The research staff member immediately implemented changes to the laboratory's animal transport procedures and the IACUC accepted the changes. No further issues have been observed by the IACUC since this incident occurred.

OLAW appreciates the consideration of this matter by the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center which was consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate this incident and prevent recurrence. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

Dear Dr. Morse,

I write to provide a final report of non-compliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals regarding an incident on April 8, 2021. Based on conversations with animal facility and laboratory staff, the IACUC determined that a research staff member accidentally left two rats in a transport container in the vivarium overnight, without food or water. These animals were found by animal facility staff with minor fight wounds and immediately placed into clean cages. Later on the same day, the animals were observed by veterinary staff and appeared to be in good condition. No medical treatment was needed for the minor fight wounds.

The responsible research staff member was counseled by a Sr. IACUC Liaison on April 8 and 9, 2021. The research staff member immediately implemented changes to their animal transport procedures and the IACUC accepted these changes. No further issues have been observed by the IACUC since. This incident was first reported to you via voicemail message by an IACUC Manager on April 15, 2021.

We believe the actions taken by the IACUC are appropriate for this situation.
