Dear Dr. Blackburn,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your June 15, 2021 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals within the animal care and use program at the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston. Your letter supplemented the information contained in an initial telephone report to this office on June 2, 2021. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on May 25, 2021, the incision sites on two rats that had undergone an approved procedure were sutured by an individual who was not approved on the protocol as a surgeon. The incision sites were not adequately apposed. The individual responsible for this incident is an approved surgeon on other collaborating Principal Investigator's protocols. The individual was only approved as a manipulator on the protocol for which this incident occurred. The animals involved in this incident were supported by NIH funding.

Corrective and preventive measures included a protocol amendment to update the role of the individual responsible for the deviation to surgeon. It was recommended the individual retake the Aseptic Surgical Techniques-Rodents course as this will allow the individual to receive more recent training on suturing techniques. Following training, the individual will be certified as an independent surgeon by a member of the veterinary staff. It is understood that no significant costs associated with this event were identified but that funds will be returned if associated costs are identified.

OLAW appreciates the consideration of this matter by the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston, which was consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. Based on the information provided, OLAW agrees that appropriate corrective and preventive actions were taken. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

Dear Dr. Morse,

On May 25, 2021, the AWC received a report of conduct of animal-related activities without appropriate AWC review and approval. The incision site of two rats having undergone a spinal contusion injury (SCI) was sutured by an individual who is approved on the protocol as a manipulator but not a surgeon. The SCI surgical procedures were performed by an approved surgeon on May 25, 2021, and observed by the individual responsible for this incident in order to begin learning the SCI model. Although the individual responsible for this incident is an approved surgeon on other collaborating Principal Investigator's protocols containing the approved SCI, the individual was only approved as manipulator on the protocol for which this incident occurred.

Both the individual and the approved surgeon were counseled on the importance of confirming proper personnel roles are described on the protocols. A protocol amendment to update the individual's role to surgeon was approved on June 7, 2021. Because the individual completed Aseptic Surgical Techniques-Rodents course on June 10, 2016, and is now undergoing training on the SCI model, it was recommended the individual retake the aseptic course as refresher retraining. The refresher training will allow the individual to receive more recent training on suturing techniques as the incision sites were not adequately apposed. Prior to the individual performing the SCI procedure independently, following training, the individual will be certified as an independent surgeon by a member of the veterinary staff.

The animals involved in this incident were supported by NIH funding (1R01NS110707-03). No significant costs associated with this event were identified. Funds will be returned if associated costs are identified.
