Three changes have been made to our institution's program for animal care and use in the previous year as detailed below.

On 24 Sep 2022, (b) (6) issued an appointment letter confirming John Sagartz, DVM, PhD, DACVP (Chief Strategy Officer and Institutional Official) as the Institutional Official for the Institutional Animal Care and Use Program Units of all the Inotiv sites including the Fort Collins, CO site.

Dan Smeak, DVM, DACVS (Vice President of Surgical Models) was appointed the Attending Veterinarian of the Fort Collins Inotiv site on 24 Jan 2022 by Andy Alexander, DVM, PhD, MBA, DABT (Institutional Official). Dr. Smeak has over 38 years of experience working as an academic research and clinical veterinary surgeon. He has been a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Surgeons (Large and Small Animal) since 1985. He was the Chief of Surgery at Ohio State University from 1995-2007; he was the prior director of the James L. Voss Veterinary Teaching Hospital at Colorado State University; and he was the Chief of Surgery at Colorado State University from 2008-2021. Dr. Smeak supervises the other three veterinarians on staff at our institution.

Our institution has implemented an additional formalized Post Approval Monitoring (PAM) program in the form of a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) describing the regular monitoring of in life study activities by trained personnel for compliance with the IACUC approved protocols and amendments. Per SOP, at least 50% of active IACUC protocols will be subject to the monitoring of select in life phases. The protocols and specific in life activities to be monitored are selected by the IACUC Chair based on: consideration of USDA pain category (with category D and E studies taking precedence); procedural complexity; requests from the IACUC, PI, or veterinary staff for monitoring; and level of OHS risk to involved staff. The activities observed and observations are documented on a checklist which is then shared with the IACUC and the PI.
