Program Change Description

Saint Louis University has made a change in our Animal Use Program following the announcement by APHIS that the USDA was replacing annual reviews of protocols already approved by the IACUC with a requirement to conduct a complete review of IACUC-approved protocols at 3-year intervals instead, effective on Dec. 27, 2021. On December 14, 2021, the Saint Louis University IACUC approved that the IACUC cease performing the Continuing Annual Review of Animal Use Protocols upon implementation of the AWA Regulation change on Dec. 27, 2021. The Saint Louis University IACUC continues to require a new submission of each Animal Use Protocol to the IACUC for review and approval at the end of the 3-year term for all Animal Use Protocols consistent with the complete review process used at Saint Louis University as required by NIH OLAW.
