Dear Dr. Christian,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your January 23, 2023 letter reporting a serious deviation from the provisions of the *Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals* at Saint Louis University, following up on an initial report on December 16, 2022. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that a dead research rat was found in a sticky insect trap on the floor of an animal procedure room. Laboratory staff had been separating weaned animals in the room and the rat probably landed on the floor undetected. The use of multiple sticky traps in this room resulted in animal care staff not identifying the problem promptly.

The corrective action consisted of directing the laboratory staff to count all animals prior to and upon completion of all procedures to ensure that all animals have been returned to their cages. Room log sheets will now indicate the presence of multiple insect traps and that these must be inspected.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. While OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals, we note that many institutions use live traps to capture escaped research rodents in animal rooms (as well as pest rodents which are then humanely euthanized). Thank you for informing OLAW about this matter.

Potential or actual effect on PHS supported activities: None. The initial report of this incident indicated funding for the research was covered by a NIH grant, however, further investigation indicated it was funded by the Foundation for Prader Willi Research.

Incident Description:

- On Nov 22, 2022, post-approval monitoring alerted veterinary staff that a dead rat was discovered in a sticky insect trap located on the floor of a vivarium animal use room.
- On Nov 22, 2022, the veterinarian emailed the IACUC Chair to report this incident.

Investigation:

- On Nov 30, 2022, the IACUC Chair and PI met to discuss the incident. The PI indicated laboratory members were separating weaned animals prior to the incident. The PI could not explain how the rat ended up on the floor.
- On Dec 16, 2022, the Chairman of the Saint Louis University IACUC contacted OLAW by email to make an initial report of the incident.
- On Dec 19, 2022, this incident of noncompliance was discussed at



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the regularly scheduled IACUC meeting. It was concluded at this meeting that during separation of weanlings on Friday November 18, one rat dropped undetected to the floor. It was also concluded a factor contributing to the death of this animal was that this room had 4 sticky insect traps rather than the normal single trap used in animal housing rooms. Weekend husbandry staff were unaware of the presence of multiple traps, and consequently, only inspected a single trap. Consequently, the rat was stuck in the sticky trap for 4 days before discovery on Tuesday, November 22, with the cause of death being dehydration. Corrective actions described below were discussed and approved by the IACUC.

- On Jan 3, 2022, the IACUC chairman sent the PI a letter detailing the IACUC's conclusion that although the incident was accidental it was noncompliant with activities described in the PI's animal use protocol. The letter also described the corrective action plan approved by the IACUC to ensure future compliance by the PI.
- On Jan 5, 2022, in a return letter the PI agreed to work with the IACUC and complete the outlined corrective action plan.

Corrective Actions taken by the Institution to address the situation:

Corrective action:

Short Term: Members of the PI's laboratory must be instructed to count animals prior to and upon completion of each procedure to ensure all animals have been returned to cages. **This has been completed.**

Long term: Comparative Medicine will modify room log sheets to indicate when multiple insect traps are present in any room and that all sticky traps must be inspected.

This has been completed.

I would like to make an initial report of noncompliance that occurred on November 22, 2022, at Saint Louis University. Our Animal Assurance Number is **D16-00141**. I am the IACUC Chairman, John Chrivia. My email is <u>John.Chrivia@Health.SLU.edu</u>, and my office number is <u>(b) (6)</u> if you have any questions or need additional information.

On November 22, 2022:Post-approval monitoring alerted veterinary staff that a dead rat was discovered in a sticky insect trap located on the floor of a vivarium animal use room. The veterinarian emailed the IACUC Chair to report this incident.

On November 30, 2022, the IACUC Chair and PI met to discuss the incident. The PI indicated prior to the incident laboratory staff were separating newly weaned animals. The PI could not explain how the rat ended up on the floor.

This research was supported by PHS funds.

A plan for prevention will be discussed by the SLU IACUC at its regularly scheduled meeting on January 9th, 2023. The plan will be implemented by January 31, 2023, and the final report from the IO with be completed and sent to OLAW by February 15, 2023.

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
