Dear Dr. Klotman,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your February 7, 2023 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the Duke University following up on an initial January 25, 2023 notification by telephone.

According to the information provided, this office understands that the Duke University Animal Care and Use Committee (ACUC) determined that instances of noncompliance occurred with respect to conditions that jeopardized the health/well-being of animals resulting in harm/death to animals. The final report states on November 29, 2022, a moribund mouse was discovered in a hood without access to food or water. In response, a clinical veterinarian was contacted, and the animal was humanely euthanized. Corrective actions taken to address the incident include the following:

- All laboratory personnel were contacted and retrained on ensuring provisions of feed and water are provided to all animals.
- The Principal Investigators and all laboratory members met with animal program leadership to review the concern.
- Actions were taken within the laboratory to refine procedures to help prevent reoccurrence.

Per the report, the IACUC completed their final review of the matter at the January 26, 2023 meeting. The committee found the corrective actions to be appropriate and no further actions were required. It is understood the funding source could not be determined and the incident was reported to OLAW out of an abundance of caution.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that the Duke University has implemented appropriate measures to correct and prevent recurrences of these problems and is now compliant with provisions of the PHS Policy.

We appreciate being informed of these matters and find no cause for further action by this Office,

Duke University, in accordance with PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report of an incident, which may have involved an animal activity conducted or supported with PHS-funds or other funds with OLAW oversight. This incident was reviewed and determined to be reportable by the Duke Institutional Animal Care & Use Committee (IACUC).

Reportable requirement: Conditions that jeopardize the health or well-being of animals, including natural disasters, accidents, and mechanical failures, resulting in actual harm or death to animals.

Preliminary report: Initial attempted contact to OLAW occurred on 12/20/22, 12/27/22, 01/05/23, and 01/13/23 by Anna Hampton (Duke University Office of Animal Welfare Assurance Director and IACUC Chair). A preliminary, verbal report was provided to Dr. Jacquelyn Tubbs on January 25th, 2023 by Dr. Hampton.

Number of animals affected: 1 mouse

Date: November 29, 2022

Description, outcome, and actions taken: A moribund mouse was found in hood without access to food or water. A clinical veterinarian was immediately contacted and the mouse was humanely euthanized. The funding source could not be determined and a report to OLAW is being submitted out of an abundance of caution.

Upon identification of this concern the following corrective measures were taken:

- All laboratory personnel were contacted and retrained on ensuring provisions for feed and water are provided to all animals.
- The Principal Investigators and all laboratory members met with animal program leadership (i.e., the Attending Veterinarian, the IACUC Chair, and/or their designees) to review the concern.
- Actions were taken within the laboratory to refine procedures to help prevent reoccurrence.

Conclusion: The Duke IACUC completed its investigation and performed final review of the issue at the January 26, 2023 IACUC meeting. The Duke IACUC determined that the incident was reportable to regulatory, granting, and oversight bodies, where applicable. In addition, the IACUC determined that the corrective actions were appropriate and no further actions were necessary. The Duke IACUC considers this incident closed.

This item was reported to Duke grants management to ensure compliance with the terms and conditions of the grant award.
