The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your May 26, 2023, letter reporting an instance of noncompliance at Arizona State University, following up on an initial March 30, 2023, email notification. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that a rat died when the line of the chamber where the animal was located was inadvertently flushed with sterilizing solution. Following an approved drug-administration procedure, the rat was too agitated to be removed from the chamber, and the animal was left there to calm down while laboratory personnel cleaned the remaining chambers. However, laboratory personnel forgot that the animal was still in the chamber and the line was flushed with sterilizing solution while still connected to the animal. The animal activity in question was supported by PHS funds.

The corrective actions consisted of the Principal Investigator discussing how routines can make individuals function on "autopilot" and the importance of making a physical reminder when the routine is not being followed. All drug administration has been completed on the protocol, although a few rats, not receiving any drug, were tested for drug-seeking behavior.

Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate, correct and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance. Your prompt and thorough resolution of this matter is commendable and consistent with the PHS Policy philosophy of monitored self-regulation. We appreciate having been informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this Office.

On March 24, 2023, the IACUC Chair, Attending Veterinarian and IACUC administration office were notified by the Principal Investigator of the death of a rat on March 23, 2023, as a result of conditions that jeopardize the health or well-being of animals. After the rat had undergone approved drug-administration, it was too agitated for safe removal from the chamber, so the lab personnel left the animal in the chamber to calm down. While the animal was calming down, the lab personnel started cleaning the other chambers. The lab personnel forgot the animal was in the chamber, and flushed the line with sterilizing solution; the line was still connected to the animal. As soon as the lab personnel realized what was happening, the flushing of the line was stopped instantly, but the animal had perished. The lab personnel confirmed the death.

A preliminary report was sent to OLAW via email on March 30, 2023.

### Corrective Action:

The Principal Investigator discussed at the next lab meeting how routines put one on "autopilot" and the importance of making a physical reminder when the routine is not being followed. Implementing this change will help prevent future incidents like this occurring.

On May 10, 2023, the PI confirmed that over the next three weeks, a few rats will be tested for drug-seeking behavior, but they will not be receiving the drug. All drug administration is complete on the protocol.

On May 25, 2023, at a fully convened IACUC meeting, the Chair informed the committee of the events that occurred and the corrective actions that have been taken. The committee acknowledged the information and believed no additional action is required at this time.
