A focused inspection was conducted by USDA on 06/27/2022.

The complainant alleged that post-op care for rabbits at Thomas Jefferson University is not being done in compliance with the IACUC approved protocol. The complainant alleged that the Attending Veterinarian is not tending to pain and distress in a timely fashion. At the time of inspection, no rabbits were present at the facility. USDA official reviewed the active rabbit protocols and corresponding individual records for the rabbits. The procedures detailed in the IACUC protocols corresponded to the procedures performed in the animal records. Rabbits received analgesia, antibiotics, and pain management as detailed in the IACUC approved protocols.

According to the Attending Veterinarian, the clinical veterinary care staff are responsible for managing the anesthesia during procedures and completing post -operative follow-up care. Post-operative records were reviewed by the USDA official. These records documented that monitoring of the rabbits occurred in accordance with the IACUC approved protocol. Daily observations were completed by animal care staff and veterinary technicians. The Attending Veterinarian observes surgical procedures performed at the facility and completes observations of all animals while housed at the facility. Animal health issues are reported to the Attending Veterinarian, who reviews the rabbits and determines treatment
