Dear Dr. Zuber

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your July 28, 2017 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, following up on an initial telephone report on June 22, 2017. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that eight mice were maintained in a cold room for one month although this time period was not approved in the protocol. The body temperatures of the mice were not monitored as required, there was no veterinary or husbandry oversight, and light cycles were not standardized. None of the mice died.

The corrective action consisted of informing the Principal Investigator who removed the investigator responsible from the protocol and deleted the cold exposure experiments from the protocol. The data will not be used and the NIH grant was not charged for any unauthorized animal activities.

Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate, correct, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance. We appreciate having been informed about this matter and find no cause for further action by this Office.

Protocol noncompliance under PHS Assurance A3125-01

Dr. Whary from the Division of Comparative Medicine (DCM) made a preliminary report concerning this protocol noncompliance to Dr. Wolfe on Thursday 06/22/2017. The incident was investigated by the CAC Chair, the AV, and the DCM Director. The CAC discussed this issue at a convened meeting on 07/13/17 and endorsed corrective actions (below). The experimental use of the affected mice was supported by NIH funding under NIGMS K08GM102718 which ended 8/30/2016 and NIDDK R01DKO47618 that ended 4/30/2017. Any unauthorized costs initially paid from the grant are being removed and covered by other sources.

On Tuesday 6/20/17, an investigator self-reported to Dr. Whary a protocol noncompliance under PI Lodish 0115-009-18 which focused on brown fat metabolism. The CAC had previously approved cold exposure (4°C) experiments lasting for up to 7 days, with a requirement for satisfactory maintenance of body core temperature (30°C minimum by rectal thermometer) as well as standard humane endpoints. Protocol approval indicated that cold exposure was to be conducted exclusively in a DCM animal facility cold room that was dedicated to this purpose and was centrally located for veterinary oversight. Experiments were conducted correctly by the Lodish lab 4 times in 2015 and once in 2016 with cold exposure lasting 6 to 24 hours without morbidity.

The protocol noncompliance was a month-long cold exposure between 11/9/16 to 12/7/16 in the Lodish lab cold room in the Whitehead Institute. This experiment was done on 6 week old AdipoqCre Syk flox/flox (n=5) and Syk flox/flox mice (n=3). The investigator monitored the mice daily but did not monitor core temperature. She readily admitted that this was a deliberate effort to circumvent the protocol conditions approved by the CAC. Although there was no morbidity, these mice did not have veterinary and husbandry oversight nor standardization of the macroenvironment such as light / dark cycles. Clearly, a major issue was the clear conflict with the MIT PHS Assurance statement on animal care.

The CAC Chair, the AV, and the DCM Director met with Dr. Lodish and the investigator on July 10. Dr. Lodish had no knowledge of this experiment and agreed it was a protocol noncompliance. Subsequent to being informed about the incident, Dr. Lodish removed the investigator from his animal protocol and at the meeting, removed the cold exposure experiments from his protocol. The CAC discussed these actions on July 13 at a convened meeting and agreed the noncompliance was serious, but resolved. The CAC additionally required that data are not to be published, presented or used in a grant application.

We trust that OLAW will find our response to this protocol noncompliance adequate. Please inform me or ndary Indiv Whary or O'Pray (CAC Chair) if you need further clarification.


