The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your February 11, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Brigham and Women's Hospital. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that a live rat was found in a refrigerator after a suspected failed carbon dioxide narcosis euthanasia attempt. A required secondary method of euthanasia had not been performed. The rat was subsequently euthanized. It was not determined if the rat in question was assigned to an activity receiving PHS or NSF funding.

Preventive actions included all rat users in the building receiving a targeted notification reviewing the proper rat euthanasia procedures. Veterinary staff will provide a retraining on rat euthanasia to the rat user group in the building where the incident occurred. All rat users in the animal care and use program will be required to undergo retraining on rat euthanasia.

The consideration of this matter by Brigham and Women's Hospital was consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-identification and self-regulation. Similarly, the actions taken to resolve the issue were appropriate and would be expected to prevent a recurrence of this incident. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office at this time.

Non-Compliance Report: Assurance **A4752-01** Brigham and Women's Hospital IACUC Funding: N/A

Dear Dr. Morse,

This letter serves as a final report on a resolved issue of non-compliance that has been reviewed by the Brigham and Women's Hospital Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee.

One rat was found in the refrigerator after a suspected failed Carbon Dioxide narcosis euthanasia. A secondary method of euthanasia was not performed to ensure death as required for this primary method. The rat was immediately euthanized by the veterinary technician who found the animal.

The IACUC extensively discussed this incident at the most recent meeting and voted to implement the following additional corrective actions:

- All rat users in the building received a targeted notification reviewing the proper rat euthanasia procedures
- The veterinary staff will provide a retraining on rat euthanasia to the rat user group in the building where the incident occurred.
- All rat users in the animal care and use program will be required to undergo retraining on rat euthanasia.
- Training records will be closely audited by the IACUC to ensure completion and compliance.

Upon completion of the rat euthanasia retraining and subsequent audit by the IACUC to ensure completion of the trainings, the Committee will consider this incident formally resolved. We will continue to report to OLAW if any similar issues occur in the future. Additionally, our institution and animal care and use committee takes the failure to ensure death after euthanasia procedures extremely seriously and we welcome any suggestions that OLAW may be able to offer.

Thank you for your review of these incidents. Please let us know if any further action is required at this time.
