First is under Section 2.38 (h)(1)(i) Miscellaneous....Health Certification (applies to USDA registered research facilities that ship NHPS): "No research facility, including a Federal research facility, shall deliver to any intermediate handler or carrier for transportation, in commerce, or shall transport in commerce any dog, cat, or nonhuman primate unless the dog, cat, or nonhuman primate is accompanied by a health certificate executed and issued by a licensed veterinarian. The health certificate shall state that: (i) The licensed veterinarian inspected the dog, cat, or nonhuman primate on a specified date which shall not be more than 10 days prior to the delivery of the dog, cat, or nonhuman primate for transportation".

Second is under Section 2.78 (a)(1) Health Certification and Identification (applies to USDA licensed dealers/brokers that ship NHPs): "No dealer, exhibitor, operator of an auction sale, broker, or department, agency, or instrumentality of the United States or of any State or local government shall deliver to any intermediate handler or carrier for transportation, in commerce, or shall transport in commerce any dog, cat, or nonhuman primate unless the dog, cat, or nonhuman primate is accompanied by a health certificate executed and issued by a licensed veterinarian. The health certificate shall state that: (1) The licensed veterinarian inspected the dog, cat, or nonhuman primate on a specified date which shall not be more than 10 days prior to the delivery of the dog, cat, or nonhuman primate for transportation".

And the third is under Section 3.86 (e) Consignments to Carriers and Intermediate Handlers....Temperature Acclimation Certification: "Carriers and intermediate handlers must not accept a nonhuman primate for transport in commerce unless their animal holding area facilities meet the minimum temperature requirements provided in §§ 3.91 and 3.92 of this subpart, or unless the consignor provides them with a certificate signed by a veterinarian and dated no more than 10 days before delivery of the animal to the carrier or intermediate handler for transport in commerce, certifying that the animal is acclimated to temperatures lower than those that are required in §§ 3.91 and 3.92 of this subpart".

Some states may have different timeframes for health certificates that are considered to be cceptable but when a USDA licensed or registered entity is delivering an NHP to a USDA registered carrier/intermediate handler for transportation (or doing the transportation themselves), the health certificate and acclimation certificate (if any) should be dated within 10 days of delivery to the T/H for transport.
