ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE.

On August 6, 2019 one male lamb, identification 201905228, was observed by the APHIS inspectors to be non-weight bearing on the right front limb. Without consulting the veterinarian or following the facility's standard procedure for treating lameness (prescribed by the veterinarian), an Animal Health Technician (AHT) treated this animal with an unapproved antibiotic off-label.

On February 14, 2019, despite veterinary instructions to keep the Dorset and Romanov ewes separate during lambing, the sheep operations staff comingled the groups. On February 26, 2019, 20 to 30% of Romanov ewes were markedly thin due to competition for food. As a result of their body condition, 2 required euthanasia.

On January 31, 2019, the veterinarian ordered an immediate ration change for a group of Romanov ewes in poor body condition. On February 5, 2019, the sheep manager still had not implemented the ration change with no explanation. On February 26, 2019 the AV documents the condition of the Romanov ewes continues to deteriorate and the AV euthanized 2 ewes on March 4th, 2019.

On January 22, 2019, one ewe was identified as being dehydrated and had difficulty rising. On January 23rd, the veterinarian give strict instructions to the AHT to separate this animal in order to facilitate increased access to food and water. On January 24th, despite the veterinarian's instructions, it was reported the ewe had not been separated. The ewe was euthanized on January 24 for poor prognosis due to dehydration and persistent recumbency.

The above incidents demonstrate repeated failures to follow AV instructions. The facility personnel's decision not to follow the AV's instructions reduces the veterinarian's ability to ensure the provision of adequate veterinary care and may have contributed to increased morbidity and mortality in the sheep operation unit. The facility shall assure that the attending veterinarian has appropriate authority to ensure the provision of adequate veterinary care and to oversee the adequacy of other aspects of animal care and use.
