Dear Dr. Ramasubramanian,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your February 12, 2019 letter reporting a serious deviation from the provisions of the Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Virginia, following up on an initial report on January 14, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that three rats died due to lack of food. After the rat shipment arrived at the institution, three rats were placed into a new cage without food and the problem was not noticed during the daily health checks.

The corrective actions consisted of terminating the employment of the two animal caretakers involved. The Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee reviewed the training program for new caretakers and found it to be adequate.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the IACUC to comply with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals.



This is to provide preliminary notification that the University of Virginia IACUC (PHS Assurance #A3245-01) identified a significant deficiency as self-reported by the Attending Veterinarian. The deficiency involved a failure of the husbandry staff to provide adequate husbandry to three newly arrived rats thus resulting in animal death. The incident is under review by the IACUC, and we will be working with the husbandry staff towards resolution. We will send you a complete report once the incident has been resolved. The IACUC tracking number for this incident is 2018-S.
