Dear Dr. Lodge,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your January 30, 2019 letter reporting a serious deviation from the provisions of the *Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals* at Washington University in St. Louis, following up on an initial telephone call on June 1, 2018. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that thirty two mice died after their cages flooded as a result of human error on the part of the animal caretaker.

The immediate action taken upon discovery consisted of placing all of the surviving mice into dry cages with supplemental heat. These animals recovered uneventfully. The animal caretaker was retrained, a senior caretaker was assigned to the area, and the laboratory staff was retrained on appropriate equipment handling.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals.

Dear Dr. Gopee,

Washington University in St. Louis (WU), in accordance with PHS Policy IV.F.3 and Assurance D16-00245, submits this final report for an adverse event initially reported by the IACUC Director on June 1, 2018.

A member of the animal facility staff discovered 26 flooded mouse cages during a routine daily observation check. A Principal Investigator reported an additional 7 flooded cages. Thirty-two mice died and all surviving mice were transferred to dry cages with additional heat support. No additional adverse clinical consequences were observed in the surviving animals. Evaluation of the equipment did not reveal a flaw or defect responsible for the incident and the root cause was identified as operator error.

The husbandry staff member responsible for the area was retrained and a different senior caretaker was assigned to the area. Appropriate equipment handling procedures were also reviewed with the lab. The IACUC has reviewed the incident and the completed corrective action plan and considers the incident resolved.

Although NIH supported researchers utilize the animal facility space, no specific costs were determined to be associated with the incident. In accordance with NIH Grants policy, any NIH funds directly associated with a noncompliant event would be returned.
