Dear Dr. Lodge,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your January 30, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Washington University in St. Louis, following up on an initial telephone report on June 1, 2018. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that an anesthetized mouse was left unattended in its cage, on a heating pad, following surgery. The animal died during the time it was unattended.

The corrective action consisted of the Principal Investigator performing fewer surgeries per day, having two individuals involved in monitoring so one person remains with the animal at all times, and retraining the laboratory staff on post-operative care and monitoring.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy.

Dear Dr. Gopee,

Washington University in St. Louis (WU), in accordance with PHS Policy IV.F.3 and Assurance D16-00245, submits this final report for a non-compliant event initially reported by the IACUC Director on June 1, 2018.

A member of the animal facility staff observed a single unattended post-operative mouse that was not fully recovered from anesthesia. The surgeon had placed the open cage on a heating pad before leaving for lunch. Follow-up conversations with the surgeon revealed that the animal died during the approximately 45 minute period when it was unattended.

In response, the principal investigator will perform fewer surgeries per day and implement a buddy system to ensure continuous monitoring. The laboratory staff will complete retraining, both online and in person with the QA/QI team. Retraining will cover appropriate methods of post-operative care and monitoring. The incident and proposed corrective actions were reviewed by the IACUC at the May 22, 2018 meeting. All aspects of the corrective action plan were completed by June 14, 2018 and the committee considers the incident resolved.

The protocol is supported by NIH funding (R01HD0091218, R01-AG052494, R01-DK100644) but no specific costs were determined to be associated with the incident. In accordance with NIH Grants policy, any NIH costs directly associated with a noncompliant event would be returned.
