- *Nonscientist* Member whose primary concerns are in a nonscientific area (for example, ethicist, lawyer, member of the clergy).
- *Nonaffiliated* Individual who is not affiliated with the institution in any way other than as a member of the IACUC, and is not a member of the immediate family of a person who is affiliated with the institution. This member is expected to represent general community interests in the proper care and use of animals and should not be a laboratory animal user. A consulting veterinarian may not be considered nonaffiliated.

The following Program changes occurred in 2019:

- 1. Mayo Clinic has been on an enhanced reporting schedule with OLAW during 2019. During the year the following changes were implemented to strengthen the animal program:
 - a. Two Post Approval Monitoring (PAM) Specialists were hired and a formal Post Approval Monitoring Program was initiated.
 - b. Two additional education specialists were hired to train Department of Comparative Medicine (DCM) personnel and laboratory personnel.
 - c. A representative from Management Engineering & Internal Consulting Services was assigned to work with DCM, IACUC and laboratory personnel to analyze the root cause(s) of husbandry issues and offer recommendations to IACUC regarding possible enhancements to the animal program.
 - d. Multiple training sessions on laboratory animal husbandry requirements were offered throughout the year to general audiences and laboratory specific sessions were required for any lab with a history of husbandry issues.

- e. Five additional animal caretaker FTE's and four additional supplemental animal caretakers were added to the DCM staff to assist with enhanced monitoring of laboratory animals.
- f. Daily water valve checks were added to the animal caretaker procedures.
- g. Mayo Rochester began a phased approach switching to the Hydropac® system.
- h. Facility orientations were revised to include didactic training and hands-on training with caging systems.
- i. IACUC held required meetings with Operation Managers and Research Administrators in an effort to gain additional support for efforts to improve the animal program. The Operation Managers and Research Administrators were advised that husbandry errors could require administrative oversight and initiation of a corrective action process for research personnel led by administration and Human Resources.
- 2. Mayo Clinic revised the educational requirements for the following groups:
 - a. For IACUC Members:
 - Care and Handling of Zebrafish
 - Essentials for IACUC Members
 - b. All researchers (as applicable):
 - Anesthesia
 - Analgesia (Pain Management)
 - Euthanasia
 - c. All researchers performing rodent survival surgery:
 - Aseptic Technique for Rodent Survival Surgery
- 3. DCM is now offering a weekly hands-on training course in aseptic rodent surgery. It will be used initially as an on-demand course, but eventually will become a required part of the Mayo Clinic animal use training curriculum.
- 4. The procedure to identify singly housed animal and provide them with additional enrichment options was revised.
- 5. The following new policy was created: d. Zebrafish Facility Policy
