The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your April 11, 2019 letter reporting a serious deviation from the provisions of the *Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals* at the California Institute of Technology, following up on an initial telephone report on March 6, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that a rhesus monkey on a fluid restriction protocol failed to receive water for more than one day.

The immediate action taken upon discovery consisted of providing water for the monkey. The animal was judged to be in good health by the veterinary staff. The corrective actions consisted of the veterinary staff and Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) counseling and retraining the laboratory staff on appropriately applying fluid restriction. A corrective action plan was developed and oversight was improved to ensure that all animals receive water as required. The NIH funding component was notified and the grant was not charged for any unauthorized animal activities.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the IACUC to comply with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals.

The California Institute of Technology, in accordance with Assurance D16-00266 (A3426-01) and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report of an incident where one NHP was not provided with water for several hours. This incident was first reported to Dr. Axel Wolff, OLAW, on March 6, 2019, via a telephone call from Karen Lencioni, DVM, DACLAM, Director of Office of Laboratory Animal Resources.

On February 12, 2019, the Office of Research Compliance received information from the Attending Veterinarian that a single NHP on a fluid regulation study was not provided with water for several hours. Upon routine review of the animal care records, the Office of Laboratory Animal Resources (OLAR) animal care staff discovered that the lab had not provided fluid as required. OLAR staff notified the laboratory to provide water immediately, and the lab responded accordingly. The animal was otherwise found in good health by the OLAR veterinary staff.

A review of billing records showed that a portion of the direct costs associated with the care of the affected animal was charged to a NIH Grant NS083063. These costs have been reallocated, invoiced to, and paid from nonfederal sources. The NIH funding component affected will be notified of the situation.

To address the situation, the veterinary staff and IACUC followed up with the laboratory to remind them of the vital importance of ensuring animals have proper and regular access to water. The laboratory underwent retraining on proper procedures for water regulation and submitted a proposed corrective action plan including an improved system of oversight to ensure correct water provision. At its meeting on April 9, 2019, the IACUC reviewed, modified, and accepted the corrective action plan as submitted by the Pl.

Caltech is committed to protecting the welfare of animals used in research and appreciates the guidance and assistance provided by OLAW in this regard. Should you have any questions regarding this report, please contact Richard Andersen, Ph.D., IACUC Chair.
