Dear Dr. Melmed,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your November 28, 2018 letter reporting a noncompliance with the PHS Policy on the Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the Cedars-Sinai Medical Center (CSMC). Your letter supplemented the information in the preliminary telephone report on October 22, 2018. From the information provide, it is understood that on September 10, 2018 two pigs were recovered from anesthesia for an MRI procedure. The pigs were euthanized nine days later. The protocol only allowed for the animals to be euthanized while still under anesthesia for the MRI procedure. It was stated that the animals were on a project funded by the PHS.

Corrective and preventive actions included a 6 month probation period for one of the investigators. During this period, he and his involved research staff must retake the CITI training. In addition, the IACUC reviewed and approved a protocol modification allowing a fully proficient member of the study team to euthanize anesthetized animals after the MRI procedure. It is understood that grant funds used have been reimburse to the grant from institutional funds. We note that the Grant Management Specialist has been notified.

OLAW believes that the corrective measures by the Cedars-Sinai Medical Center (CSMC) are consistent with the provisions of the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals for institutional self-monitoring, self-correction, and self-reporting. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.


