The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your May 18, 2017 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that non-pharmaceutical grade Avertin was used as an anesthetic for survival and non-survival procedures.

The corrective action consisted of the Principal Investigator stopping use of the unapproved drug, amending the protocol, counseling the laboratory staff, and reviewing the protocol procedures with the staff. The laboratory was placed under enhanced post-approval monitoring.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy. Please remember to include the species involved in the final report as well as the grant number(s) if the project was PHS/NSF-supported. Thank you for informing OLAW about this matter.
