Dear Dr. Manning,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your February 27, 2019 letter providing a final report regarding a serious deviation from the provisions of the Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the Department of Veterans Affairs Tennessee Valley Healthcare System (TVHS), a covered component of Vanderbilt University Medical Center, and following up on an initial report on January 29, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that two mice died due to lack of water caused by a missing water bottle.

The corrective actions consisted of retraining the TVHS animal care staff on policies, standard operating procedures, daily health checks, and prompt reporting of animal health concerns to the veterinarians. The staff responsible was counseled and disciplined. The Vanderbilt Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) will continue monitoring the TVHS animal care and use program.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and reduce the likelihood of a recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the IACUC and TVHS to comply with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

In accordance with PHS Policy IV.F.3.a., Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC)/ Vanderbilt University (VU) or the Department of Veterans Affairs Tennessee Valley Healthcare System (TVHS) Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) is self-reporting an incident involving mice found dead without access to water in the cage. A preliminary report was filed via phone by VUMC with OLAW on January 29, 2019.

This is the final report provided to the Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) regarding the issue.

Species Involved: Mouse

Funding Source: Veterans Affairs

Incident Description:

The report from TVHS indicated that on January 2nd, one mouse was found dead in a cage with no water bottle. The TVHS Animal Care Technician (ACT) supplied water and wet food to the remaining mice at that time. The following day an additional mouse was found dead.

IACUC Actions Taken and Corrective Plans:

The information gathered by OAWA during its investigation, which included a response by TVHS outlining steps already taken to address the incident, was brought to the attention of the IACUC at a convened meeting on January 23, 2019. The TVHS corrective action consisted of a review of all relevant policies and SOPs with TVHS ACTs, clarification of duties for the staff regarding room checks and reporting of animal health concerns to the Division of Animal Care Veterinary staff, and counseling and disciplinary actions for relevant staff.

The IACUC discussed TVHS' response to the incident and found it addressed the concerns and provided an appropriate plan to prevent reoccurrence of the issue. The IACUC considers the event closed but will continue to monitor

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your January 29, 2019 letter reporting a serious deviation from the provisions of the *Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals* at the Department of Veterans Affairs Tennessee Valley Healthcare System which is a covered component of the Vanderbilt University Medical Center, following up on an initial telephone report on the same day. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that two mice died due to lack of water caused by a missing water bottle.

The immediate action taken upon discovery consisted of providing water and wet food to the surviving mice. The corrective actions consisted of retraining the animal care staff on policies and procedures, on the conduct of daily health checks, and on reporting of health concerns to the veterinary staff. The individuals responsible were counseled and disciplined. The Vanderbilt Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) is continuing to investigate.

Thank you for informing OLAW about this matter. We will keep this case open and await the final report after the IACUC has completed its investigation.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

In accordance with PHS Policy IV.F.3, Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC)/ Vanderbilt University (VU) or the Department of Veterans Affairs Tennessee Valley Healthcare System (TVHS) Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) is responding to the OLAW letter dated December 19, 2018, regarding OLAW Case #5L. OLAW requested an update on February 1, 2019, regarding new hires and the status of success or failure in providing adequate food and water to research animals (mice).

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The Division of Animal Care (DAC) provided information, related to the OLAW request, to the IACUC at the December 2018 and January 2019 IACUC meetings as required by the IACUC.

The DAC reported at the January 23, 2019 convened IACUC meeting that the mouse census is approximately 24,500 cages; therefore, 24 Animal Care Technicians (ACTs) are needed to appropriately maintain this number of cages. The DAC is currently staffed with 22 ACTs.

As of the January 23rd IACUC meeting, no new cases have been reported at VUMC/VU. The IACUC will continue to require reporting of new hires and the status of success or failure in providing adequate food and water to research animals until the Committee is satisfied that staffing and animal welfare concerns have been resolved.

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One case where mice were found dead without access to water at TVHS was self-reported to the IACUC on January 17, 2019. The report indicated that on January 2nd, one mouse was found dead in a cage with no water bottle. Records indicated the animals were without water access for approximately 24 hours. The TVHS supplied water and wet food to the remaining mice at that time. The following day an additional mouse was found dead. The TVHS corrective action consisted of a review of all relevant policies and SOPs with TVHS animal care staff, clarification of duties for staff regarding room checks

The IACUC has reviewed the response and will continue to monitor the situation and assist the TVHS in assuring that all animal care requirements are being met. A separate report of the incident will be filed with OLAW upon completion of the IACUC investigation.
