Dear Dr. Horn,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your May 21, 2018 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at New York University, following up on an initial telephone report on May 1, 2018. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that seven dead rats were found in the carcass freezer but had apparently been alive when placed there. The animals had been exposed to CO2 for euthanasia but death had not been verified.

The corrective action consisted of retraining the laboratory staff responsible on appropriate conduct of euthanasia including use of a secondary physical method to ensure death following CO2 exposure. Signage at the CO2 euthanasia chambers indicates the requirement for use of a secondary method to ensure death.

Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate, correct, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance. We appreciate having been informed about this matter and find no cause for further action by this Office.

New York University Washington Square Campus (NYUWSC), in accordance with Assurance A3317-01 and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report of noncompliance regarding an incident of unintended recovery of animals after apparent death from CO2. On April 26th, 2018, Office of Veterinary Resources (OVR) staff reported finding 7 expired rats in an animal necropsy freezer, some of whom apparently chewed out of a red bag which was meant for disposal after CO2 euthanasia.

The animals involved were used under University Animal Welfare Committee (UAWC) approved protocol number 13-1411 and were NIH funded by grant # RO1MH100822-A1. This incident was first reported to your attention on May 1st, 2018 via a telephone call by Mark Klinger, DVM, DACLAM, Attending Veterinarian and Director, OVR.

On May 3rd, 2018, all members of the research lab involved were retrained on appropriate methods of rodent euthanasia. Training included verification of death by a second method after exposure to CO2 using wet lab demonstration conducted by the OVR Facility Manager. Initial training of personnel was reviewed and the training presentation was modified to emphasize appropriate methods of CO2 euthanasia and secondary verification of death. In addition, signage present at the CO2 euthanasia stations was reviewed to make sure the instructions and guidelines included the requirement of verification of death by an appropriate secondary method.

At their meeting on May 16, 2018, the NYUWSC UAWC (IACUC) reviewed this incident, the corrective actions taken, and recommended that the IO report the incident to OLAW.
