Dear Dr. LeJeune,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your January 12, 2017 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the Allegheny-Singer Research Institute, following up on an initial telephone notification on September 23, 2016. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that a rabbit experiencing an adverse event was inappropriately euthanized with subcutaneous Fatal Plus IV, a method not approved by the IACUC and contrary to the recommendations of the AVMA Guidelines on Euthanasia: 2013 Edition. The unconscious animal was later euthanized by administering intracardiac Fatal Plus IV and death was verified by the absence of a heart beat followed by a bilateral thoracotomy. The associated animal activity in question was not PHS funded.

The corrective action consisted of mandatory re-training of the responsible Principal Investigator and research personnel on the relevant noncompliance issues related to this incident.

The establishment and application of policies and practices that are consistent with the provisions of the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the Allegheny-Singer Research Institute are commendable and avoid the perception of a double standard. We appreciate having been informed about this matter and find no cause for further action by this Office.

Dear Dr. Wolff,

This letter is provided to OLAW in follow up to a preliminary report provided by phone September 23, 2016 regarding non-compliance that occurred at Allegheny Singer Research Institute (Assurance #: A3693-01). The noncompliance consisted of a failure to adhere to the approved protocol, which is defined as a serious deviation by The Guide.

On August 30, 2016, one of the study animals underwent experimental procedures and had a clinical adverse event (cyanosis) that required euthanasia (per approved protocol). The research staff did not use the approved protocol method of euthanasia nor was it in accordance with AVMA Guidelines. Rather than administering Fatal Plus IV, it was administered subcutaneously. The animal was unconscious but still alive after 1 hour. Research staff recognized the issue and immediately sought veterinarian assistance. Veterinarian staff ensured deep sedation and administered Fatal Plus intracardiac, as IV access could not be gained to euthanize the animal. Death was confirmed by verifying no heart beat for one minute and a bilateral thoracotomy was performed. This veterinarian staff-administered procedure was performed per AVMA guidelines.

The IACUC discussed the incident and accepted a corrective action plan (CAP) that required PI and Research Staff mandatory re-training in the areas of non-compliance.
