The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your May 16, 2017 letter reporting the suspension of an animal activity at Thomas Jefferson University, following up on an initial report on March 2, 2017. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee took this action after determining that the Principal Investigator (PI) failed to keep adequate documentation of breeding, monitoring, anesthesia, and euthanasia of mice.

The corrective action consisted of animal care and use program personnel counseling the PI and requiring the submission of monthly animal work reports that include a colony census and description of any phenotypic strains that require monitoring. The PI was counseled that records must not deviate from the approved protocol. The PI was extensively retrained, the laboratory was placed on enhanced post-approval monitoring, and the protocols for grants R01NS097530 and R21NS098393 were subsequently reinstated.

Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate, correct, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance. We appreciate having been informed about this matter and find no cause for further action by this Office.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

Thomas Jefferson University, in accordance with Assurance #D16-00051 (A3085-01) and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report of noncompliance regarding the mouse protocols 01452 and 01456. This incident was first reported to OLAW on March 2, 2017 in a phone call made by Secondary individual the IACUC Post-Approval Monitor.

On February 28th, the IACUC committee voted to suspend the above mentioned protocols. This decision was based on multiple incidents of insufficient records and documentation relating to the breeding, monitoring, anesthesia, and euthanasia of her animals. The PI was frequently unable to produce such records when requested and was slow/unresponsive when asked to correct these deficiencies. When asked to explain inconsistencies in records, the PI did not seem to understand that without proper records, the IACUC could not verify that monitoring had been done in accordance with approved protocols.

To address the situation, The IACUC Chair, the IACUC Post Approval Monitor, the Attending Veterinarian, the Clinical Veterinarian, and myself have met with the PI to outline the conditions for reinstatement, and for animal work moving forward. The PI will submit monthly animal work reports that include a detailed census of the colony, including but not limited to any strains that may display a phenotype requiring monitoring. In addition, the PI has undergone extensive retraining with the IACUC Post-Approval Monitor and the Clinical Veterinarian. Brief visits from the Post-Approval Monitor will continue to occur on a weekly basis for the foreseeable future. Finally, the IACUC Chair has informed the PI that in the future, provided records must not deviate from what is outlined in the protocol, and that any further failure to maintain these records may result in permanent suspension of animal work at Thomas Jefferson University. A letter explaining these conditions has been personally delivered to the PI by the IACUC Chair. Having been retrained and agreeing to the above conditions, the IACUC reinstated the two protocols on April 25th, 2017.

Dear Dr. Zhang,

At its meeting earlier this morning, the IACUC voted to reinstate your animal use privileges effective upon your receipt of this letter. Keycard access to the animal facility will be turned on for you and members of your laboratory. Going forward, the IACUC Committee reiterated, you MUST FOLLOW procedures described in your approved animal use protocols. Further deviation from approved animal work will be met with severe penalties which could include revoking animal use privileges while you are employed by Jefferson.

For the next 12 months, the IACUC requests monthly reporting detailing all animal work performed in the previous month. Please include updated animal census reports of your colony every month. Someone from the IACUC will stop by your lab weekly to see how things are progressing and to answer any questions you may have.

Please ensure that all research reports, for grants or publication purposes, are accurate and do not contain copy/paste errors. Further instances of inaccurate reporting may be deemed research misconduct to be handled by other institutional offices.

Hi, Melissa. I am following up on your email exchange with secondary individua (attached) regarding appropriate expenses during the IACUC protocol suspension.

Can salary continue to be charged to the grants for **non-animal related activities** during the suspension? For example, experiment design, manuscript writing, data analysis, etc.? In other words, activities that would not require IACUC approval.

The NoA's say "Funds included in this award may only be used for the maintenance and care of the animals during the period of IACUC suspension. Once the suspension has been lifted, a confirmation must be submitted to and accepted by NINDS staff before studies involving vertebrate animals may resume."

Normally, I would assume that expenses related to non-animal work would be ok, but the language on the NoA could be interpreted as NO expenses at all.
