The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your September 26, 2018 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at The Pennsylvania State University. Your letter supplements the information contained in a prompt telephone report to this office on September 24, 2018. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on September 6, 2018 it was determined that post-op records were incomplete for some rats that had undergone surgeries. There was no indication that any complications had arose from the surgeries. This activity was PHS funded.

Corrective actions included The PI retraining the responsible student stressing the importance of regular post-op care, monitoring and record keeping. The PI will audit the post-op notes of all animals.

The PI, his Department Head and Research Dean have been notified that no unallowable costs may be charged to the NIH grant during the period of noncompliance.

OLAW appreciates the prompt consideration of this matter by The Pennsylvania State University, which was consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate this incident and prevent recurrence. OLAW concurs that the incident warranted reporting. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

The Pennsylvania State University, in accordance with Assurance A3141-01 and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report of noncompliance regarding the Principle Investigator's (PI) failure to follow Institutional policies. The activities were associated with a protocol that is supported by PHS funds. This incident was reviewed by the IACUC on September 19, 2018 and was reported to OLAW via telephone message on September 24, 2018.

On September 6th, an investigator reported incomplete records on a rat that had undergone surgery on August 30th. According to the report, only four of the seven required post-op checks had been recorded. The IACUC investigated the additional post-op records of the lab group and discovered four other instances where one or more post-op check was not recorded. While there is no indication that any complications had arose from the surgeries, this lack of record keeping was inconsistent with policy and the protocol.


To address the situation, the PI took corrective actions. This plan included:

- 1. The PI retrained the student responsible for not recording the checks. This training included:
  - a. Stressing the importance of regular post-op care and monitoring.
  - b. The various elements of record keeping, including the need for sufficient notes to guide proper care and track potential problems.
  - c. That from a compliance and oversight standpoint, lack of notes is equivalent to the work not having been done
  - 2. The PI will audit the post-op notes of all animals.

After review of this plan, the IACUC deemed this action acceptable.
